from your Pastor

The Body and Blood of Christ

One of my priest friends was found suffering from depression, an illness that is gripping a lot of people around us. This friend of mine is well cared for by his Family and the diocese. He is fed well; he does not have any financial worries; he has got good accommodation. Yet he started to feel insecure and unwell. In such occasions we are made to realise that "man does not live by bread alone". (Deut 8:3b) My friend needed to feel that he is needed and wanted. He needed to be bonded to a good friend.

"He (God) humbled you, he made you feel hunger, he fed you with manna which neither you nor your fathers had known." (Deut. 8:3a). God's people felt the need for God and God did not disappoint them. Till today the Jewish people thank God for the exodus experience. That is central to their lives.

But we have a more profound reason to thank God. Jesus established Eucharist and asked his disciples to do it in his memory. Holy Mass is the source and summit of our spiritual life. Eucharist is the way for us to bond with God in a tangible and empirical manner. In the sixth chapter of St John's Gospel Jesus says, "The one who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has internal life." It is an amazing thing to bond with God in a very tangible way.

To make this bonding or communion with God at Eucharist very effective, we can do two things. First of all we should come to Mass with a special intention in mind to pray for. When the priest says, "let us pray" before the Bible readings, you can pray in your heart for the intention you have in mind. Secondly we should ask forgiveness from God for our sins. Having taken care of these two aspects, our Eucharistic celebration will become a very powerful prayer. Such prayer can be so powerful that it may even effect in physical healing in some people.

The Eucharist embodies everything that Jesus did for us and everything Jesus' is for us. It is the mystery of faith that gathers together Jesus' teaching, his passion, his resurrection, and his pledge of eternal life for us. If we stay close to the Mass, we will never drift far from the Lord. That is exactly what Jesus intended when he said, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him."

Development projects for the Parish

Feast of the Week

24 June — The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist. Solemnity

This feast was observed on this date in the fourth century. It celebrates the holy birth of "the greatest of all the prophets," the one who leapt for joy in his mother's womb, who prepared the way for Christ, announced his presence, and baptised him in the Jordan River.





27 Friday—The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Solemnity

This devotion, which dates back to the Middle Ages, flowered in France in the seventeenth century as a result of the visions of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque (16 October). The feast was extended to the entire Western Church by Pius IX in 1856. It recalls the mystery of God who is love, and honours the heart of Jesus as the source and centre of the incarnate love of God.
