## Sacrifice, a way of life

Mercy is a high achiever, practicing corporate law. She is also good looking and many young people like to court her. But she decided to join a convent and spend the rest of her life evangelizing. Her friends. hearing of her decision said, she must be mad to throw away such a successful life and become a recluse. But Mercy's decision to give up fame, money, and the prospect of a great husband and a family of her own, was a sacrifice God will reward. That is the only thing Mercy wanted in her life. This is one scenario of sacrifice. There are plenty of such dedicated people, willing to make sacrifices for the sake of the Kingdom of God, which makes the Church present to the world in all kinds of situations.

I am also reminded of another scenario. When I asked the parishioners to consider donating the equivalent of one hour's earning to the Church, one of them did his sums. He realised that his share will be a couple of thousand dollars a year. That is too big an ask, he thought. Therefore he decided to withdraw from the planned giving program all together.

Jesus told his disciples that he is on his way to Jerusalem, where his life will become a sacrifice. Peter, who saw the transfiguration on Mount Tabor, and was later entrusted the keys to the Kingdom of God, found it too difficult to accept the concept of self-sacrifice. Jesus rebuked him. The thought to avoid all sacrifices comes from the devil. The impulse to bathe in all kinds of glory and do not take in any pain will turn out to be a destructive way of life. To gain life and keep it in tact we should follow Jesus. We, as followers of Jesus Christ, should have our lives focussed on Jesus and his mission. It will not always be easy to be committed to Jesus. Commitment to the cause of the Kingdom of God will require us to make sacrifices in our lives.

It is not easy to make sacrifices. It can be irksome. Only love can make our self- sacrifices easy. The greater our love for Jesus, the greater our willingness to make sacrifices will be. Every life of love involves walking the path of the Cross. Perhaps the greatest mistake many people of our time make is to avoid crosses at any cost. As true followers of Christ, let us be brave enough to take up sacrifices.

# Feast of the Week.

3 September- St Gregory the Great Born about 540. Died in Rome in 604. While prefect of Rome, he founded monasteries there and in Sicily and himself became a monk. Called to be a deacon of Rome by Benedict I, and then sent as papal legate to Constantinople. Elected pope in 590. Reorganised Church life and administration in a time of crisis, sponsored liturgical reform, and initiated the evangelisation of the English. Remembered also for his extensive writings on pastoral care, spirituality, and morals, and for his self-designation as "servant of the servants of God."


