# Are your Paulo Are you a builder

# or destroyer?

For the past few Sundays we have been hearing about the kingdom of God and its important invitation to us. Through the readings today we are again reminded that we have to work hard to build up this kingdom to bear good fruits, and also to be watchful of its enemies. We have the responsibility to protect it and help it grow.

In the Gospel the vineyard is compared with the people of Israel. Yahweh is the owner. The people of Israel were entrusted with their religious leaders. They persecuted, oppressed and even killed the prophets and seers whom God had sent to guide them.

Isaiah used this parable to describe Israel's infidelity and Gods disappointment with them. God lavished kindness on the people and asked only for the fruits of the harvest. This of course symbolized justice and good works, which is a way of expressing fidelity to the covenant between God and his people.

The God of life and love wants justice to rule in the midst of his people and he wants the rights of everyone especially the poorest, and needy to be respected and restored. Since they refused to do so, God intended to uproot and level the vineyard.

Look at ourselves. We have been given so much by God, how can we give back? Each day we are given countless opportunities to serve and to make the world a better place. We all possess different talents, time and skills which must be nurtured and integrated into our lives. According to Islam the highest form of generosity is your life. Time, talent, comfort, and caring for others welfare, will lead to achieving a higher level with God. Through various activities, especially by arms giving, we become united with God and one another. For them the lowest form of generosity is money, because it is given to you by God, its Gods mere generosity. So we have to use it well, for the good of others. There is a saying "the people, who give you their food, give you their heart".

The tenants lost the ability to recognize their heir, lost interest in the importance of him. They have ceased to care about their future life and forgotten that their future wellbeing is tied up with cooperating with and respecting the heir. The First Letter of John says, the sensual body, the lustful eye, pride in possessions, have done their work on the tenants and they have lost whatever virtue they might originally had.

The Gospel of Mathew tells us that failing to feed the poor is the same as denying Christ himself, which means condemning the poor and Christ to death. Being Christian is precisely giving life. This is what the Gospel requires and if we put it into practice, the God of peace will be with you (Ph.4;6-9)

God invites everyone to cooperate with him in the building up of His kingdom and anyone who is against it will be rejected. What is your personal response to this personal invitation?

# Feast of the Week.

7 October - Our Lady of the Rosary This commemoration was established in 1573 in thanksgiving for a Christian victory over the Ottoman forces at Lepanto. It entered the general calendar in the eighteenth century. It is a memorial of the Virgin Mary as honoured in the rosary, a form of prayer combining the salutation of the angel (Luke 1:28) with meditation on the saving mysteries of Christ. Originally the rosary was the laity's "psalter," the Hail Marys replacing the 150 psalms.

- 1. Make the sign of the Cross and pray the Apostolic Creed
- 2. Pray the Our Father
- 3. Pray three Hail Marys
- 4. Pray Glory Be to the Father
- 5. Announce the mystery for reflection and pray the Our Father

- 7. Finish the decade with the Glory Be to the Father
- 8. On completion of five decades pray Hail Holy Queen.


