### Give to God what is due to Him

Sometimes truth can be unbearable for some people. Jesus, speaking with authority on the Kingdom of God, confronted the duplicity in the lives of the leaders. Therefore they got together and planned to corner Jesus. That is the context of the Gospel today, where Jesus says; give to Caesar what is Caesar's and Give to God what is God's.

The Pharisees, Sadducees, and the Herodians were all offended by what Jesus preached. Therefore they all were against him and they made an alliance to destroy Jesus. It is interesting to note that these three groups of people did not get along with each other. Pharisees and Sadducees, though Jews, upheld different theologies. While the Pharisees believed in the resurrection of the body, the Sadducees denied it. But both these groups of people were against Roman Imperialism of Israel. But the Herodians supported Herod their king who ruled Palestine for the Roman Emperor. Because of their opposition to Jesus, the enemy of the enemy became an ally.

The trick question is whether giving tax to the Roman Emperor is right or not. If Jesus was to answer yes, they wanted to accuse him of lack of patriotism to the Jews who were fighting for freedom from Roman Imperialism. If Jesus were to say not to give tax, that would be a criminal offence against their emperor. But Jesus seeing through their intentions asked for a coin and asked what they see on the coin. It was clearly marked for Caesar with his image on it. So give it to him and give to God what is due to God.

Reliance on Money for securing eternal salvation for oneself will be futile. Therefore one should know that no one can propitiate God with money. It is the disposition of the heart and honesty to God that will win favour before God. This teaching of Jesus also points to what kind of relationship state and religion should have. Theocratic State, where religion and politics are fused, is not a desirable one. They both belong to two different realms. Yet any national politics with no consideration for religious teachings and values will be dangerous. The discussion on Euthanasia in Australia highlights the importance of religious values.

Last week, our Archbishop elect Anthony Fisher wrote a comment in the Sydney Morning Herald. He argued that the killing of people in the name of Euthanasia will be a dangerous move. Therefore in this matter the government should not legislate according to the popular opinion. It should listen to the teachings and values of religion - not just Catholics. but all religions. Palliative care is more compassionate than helping suicide. This is one case of state and religion relationship. Moral teaching and formation of children through catholic schools is another one.

Of course we do need to give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, but we should always be mindful of giving God due reverence. Father George Kallumkal, who supplied in my absence, told you a number of stories of how rewarding and effective his reliance on God was in his mission. Do not consider money as the best security in life. Always make sure God is at the centre of life and our life will have the best of security.



SYNOD OF BISHOPS

Pastoral Challenges to the Family in the Context of Evangelization



Pope Francis has opened a landmark synod of bishops from around the world which is reviewing Church teaching on the family and marriage. For Catholic Bishops the synod is one of the most important meetings in which they may participate. Two hundred sixty-two bishops have gathered to discuss the theme "Pastoral Challenges of the Family in Context of Evangelization." The bishops and a small number of lay figures are addressing the gulf between what the Church says about issues such as divorce, contraception, pre-marital sex and homosexuality and what many followers

actually do. The Bishops, families and the Pope himself are discussing some of the challenges faced by modern day families and what the Church can do to help.

The two week Synod will conclude on October 19th. The second phase of the Synod, where concrete decisions are expected, will take place from October 4th to the 25th, 2015.


