The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica



Today the Church celebrates the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica



in Rome. The Basilica of St.
John Lateran is the cathedral of
Rome. This, not St. Peter's, is
the Pope's cathedral. Also
called the Church of Holy
Saviour or the Church of St.
John Baptist, it was the baptism
church of ancient Rome. The
original church was built by
Laterani family in the time of

Constantine and was consecrated by Pope Sylvester in 324. Since then it was destroyed and rebuilt many times in the history. The feast of the Dedication became a universal celebration in 1565 in honour of the basilica called "the mother and mistress of all churches of Rome and the world" as a sign of love for and union with the See of Peter.


St Paul in his letter to the Church in Corinth speaks of building the temple of God. "Do you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple" (1Cor3:16-17) Dear friends, today's feast reminds us of God's desire to build a spiritual temple in the world, a community that worships him in spirit and truth. Pope Benedict XVI said, "But this observance also reminds us of the importance of the material buildings in which the community gathers to celebrate the praises of God. Every community therefore has the duty to take special care of its own sacred buildings, which are a precious religious and historical patrimony."

We live the reality of Church at the parish level. Just as much as we want our church to be clean, tidy, and elegant, we shall try to do the same with our personal and community life as well. Once we do not lose our focus on building the temple of God within us, we see water of life flowing from it and life teeming in it, just as we read from Prophet Ezekiel in the first reading at Mass today. Let us pray and work towards making this a reality for us and for others.

Evolution and Big Bang theory are right

Last week one of the parishioners directed my attention to an article that appeared in The Independent, written by Adam Withnall and asked me to comment on it. Below is my comment. Quotes from the article can be seen in blue.

Speaking at the Pontifical Academy of Sciences, the Pope made comments which experts said put an end to the "pseudo theories" of creationism and intelligent. The theories of evolution and the Big Bang are real and God is not "a magician with a magic wand", Pope Francis has declared. Adam wrote that Francis explained that both scientific theories were not incompatible with the existence of a creator – arguing instead that they "require it". "When we read about Creation in Genesis, we run the risk of imagining God was a magician, with a magic wand able to do everything. But that is not so," Francis said.

Contrary to common belief and the teachings of some Christian denominations, Genesis 1:1-2:4a, where the Bible speaks of God creating the world, is not primarily about how God created the world. Genesis states that the one true God created everything and He did it unopposed. "God said, let there be light, and there was light." (Genesis 1:3) This means His word is so powerful. God is omnipotent – capable of doing anything without any other assistance. This was a very significant revelation when there were many stories and myths describing how the creator struggles to emerge out of the chaos and bring about earth and its creatures. Another predominant belief was that the world and the creatures are the result of the struggle between good and evil. The Book of Genesis categorically affirms that our God neither needed to struggle nor needed any means to create the world. The other teaching of the Book of Genesis is that human beings surpass all other created beings by reason of his special relationship to God. The vegetation is created as a product of earth. That means they are not to be worshipped. Thus Genesis teaches against any cult that would worship trees and plants. The sun and moon were created to separate day and night, that means they are instruments to do a function for the human beings. Therefore worshipping them also is not right. On the sixth day God created the human beings and ordered humans to have dominion over creation. God who created the whole universe, finished his work in six days and rested on the seventh day. "God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because he had rested from all the work he had done in creation" (Genesis 2:3). The implication is that, if God who did all the creation rested on the seventh day and made it holy, we his chosen people and creatures should be following that model and keeping the Sabbath. So the whole narrative which is called creation story is a catechetical passage with teachings about how to order our religious life. God surely created Human beings, but the Genesis account is not a teaching about the process or time of creation. This should help us appreciate Pope Francis' comments.

"He (God) created human beings and let them develop according to the internal laws that he gave to each one so they would reach their fulfilment. "The Big Bang, which today we hold to be the origin of the world, does not contradict the intervention of the divine creator but, rather, requires it. "Evolution in nature is not inconsistent with the notion of creation, because evolution requires the creation of beings that evolve."

Adam Withnall said that Pope Francis's comments were more in keeping with the progressive work of Pope Pius XII, who opened the door to the idea of evolution and actively welcomed the Big Bang theory. In 1996, John Paul II went further and suggested evolution was "more than a hypothesis" and "effectively proven fact".

Therefore contrary to the popular belief of many, neither Bible nor the teachings of the Church are incompatible with scientific theories of the origin of the universe and theories of evolution. Yet we have to say that the reality of the universe cannot be explained by science alone. More importantly human soul is purely God's creation and not the result of any evolution.

Novena & Magic Spells

Novena is a devotional practice of praying nine consecutive days or one day a week for nine consecutive weeks. The prayers may be for a particular intention and are in honour of a particular saint or a particular facet of the life of Our Lord or Our Lady. It is preferable that the person making the prayer attend Mass and receive Holy Communion. Though Novenas became popular only in the 17th century, we can find a basis for it the Acts of the Apostles. Between the Ascension of Our Lord and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, the Apostles "with one accord devoted themselves to pray, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers." (Cf Acts 1:14). In such prayers they were asking for God's grace, but not demanding anything particularly from God. They knew that God who knows their needs and loves them will grant the necessary graces for them.

Occasionally I find leaflets of Novena Prayers left in the church. These leaflets often contain the promise that if you "Leave nine copies of this prayer in Church for nine consecutive days, prayers will be answered on or before the ninth day and has never failed." This statement troubles me; because it appears to use this prayer as a kind of Magic Spell. It is more like pre-Christian times what ancient Romans and Greeks did. They prayed for nine days with the belief that just by doing the ritual they can avert the wrath of God. St Augustine condemned the practice of Christians imitating such practices. Therefore any leaflet found in our church with false guarantee that their wishes will be granted by God, will be removed.

True prayer is connecting with God and then trusting Him to do the best for us. A true Christian prayer does not tell God what He should be doing.

Feasts of the Week.



10 November - St Leo the Great Died in Rome on this day in 461. Elected pope in 440. Tried to protect the city from the devastation of barbarian invasion. His surviving letters illustrate the leadership and guidance he exercised as bishop of Rome toward other Churches in the West. Remembered for the clarity of his thought on the two natures of Christ, affirmed at the Council of Chalcedon, for his eloquent sermons, and for the prayers he composed for the Roman liturgy.

11 November - St Martin of Tours Born in Pannonia (Hungary) about 316. Died in 397 and was buried on this day in Tours (France). A catechumen who was in conscience unable to continue with military service. Baptised at the age of eighteen, for a time became a hermit, and then worked to establish monasticism in the West. Bishop of Tours for twenty -five years. One of the first non-martyrs to be venerated as a saint. Widely remembered for his legendary generosity to the poor, for arguing against the persecution of heretics, and especially for his active evangelisation and pastoral care of rural areas.





12 November - St Josephat Born in Vladimir (Ukraine) in 1580. Died at Vitebsk (Belarus) on this day in 1623. A Basilian monk who became archbishop of Polotsk. Worked strenuously to uphold and spread the Union of Brest-Litovsk by which Churches of the province of Kiev, with their Byzantine liturgy and customs, had entered into communion with Rome. In a complex situation of national and religious antagonism, he was killed by violent opponents. Remembered for his energetic pastoral reform and courageous ecumenism.


