Be a Surprise Gift to Someone

Everyone is getting ready for Christmas. It is around the corner. The mood of the world is that of great blessings where symbols of joy are displayed at the entrances, meeting places, shopping centres, and work places. Business is booming because it is the season everyone gives gifts to others. The Church announces the second coming of Christ and the hope attached to it as the theme for reflection in the first two weeks of Advent. But the world around us is behaving as if there is no need to look forward to His second coming, because we have all that we need. It is a blessed time for everyone. But it is not the case all over the world. Christians in middle eastern countries could be wondering why there is such a delay for the Lord to come again. In the face of Islamic atrocities the faithful Christians in these areas fear for their lives and livelihood. Many are killed and many others are driven out of their home land. Unfortunately we do not hear of many Muslim leaders condemning such atrocities against Christians. The developments we see in some parts of the Middle East should lead us to expect more far reaching consequences. As world citizens we should be conscious of this dichotomy as we prepare ourselves for Christmas.

A Prayer for Peace by Saint Ephraim the Syrian is appropriate for this season. Melkite Catholic Bishop Robert Rabbat has been promoting this prayer. Let us also join with Christians of Middle Eastern traditions to recite this prayer every day at least till Christmas as part of our preparation.

Prayer for Peace

Almighty God and Creator, You are the Father of all people on the earth. I beseech you to guide all the nations and their leaders in the ways of justice and peace. Protect us from the evils of injustice, prejudice, exploitation, conflict, and war. Help us to put away mistrust, bitterness, and hatred. Teach us to cease the storing and using of implements of war. Lead us to find peace, respect, and freedom. Unite us in the making and sharing of tools of peace against ignorance, poverty, decease, and oppression. Grant that we may grow in harmony, and friendship as brothers and sisters created in your image, to your honour and praise. Amen.

We shall also observe next weekend as a Day of Prayer for the persecuted Christians of the Middle East. There will also be a collection at the door next week as a financial assistance to these Christian Communities.

Walking the talk and capturing the spirit of the prayer, let us also make our lives a gift to others. The Gospel today tells us that the next coming of the Lord will be a surprise to everyone. There will not be any time to for quick preparation. Therefore be ready always for the unexpected appearance of the Lord. At your baptism you were anointed (Christened) to be another Christ. Now in this time of Advent let us make our life be a surprise gift to others. Making our lives gifts will be harder than buying something from a shop shelf. It needs more deliberation and commitment. And that is what is required of us to be ready for Christmas. So use your imagination, time, and your sense of duty to others, to make your life a gift. You be the surprise gift to someone.

Christmas Mass Roster



Advent

Along with the Advent Season, Christmas time is rich in traditions which, despite modern commercial exploitation, still stir our hearts and imagination. The Christmas tree, the manger scene, the music and carols, the lights shining in the darkness joyfully proclaim the birth of Jesus Christ and call us to come and adore him.

Christmas and Advent can be a spiritual feast for those who live these seasons spiritually. Let the Child and Joseph and Mary teach us the dignity and importance of children and families. In a parish like ours, with such a diverse demography, the Christmas season's rich traditions come from peoples throughout the world. Let them remind us of the unity of all people as children of God.

Advent Wreath

The origins of the Advent wreath are apparently from Germany. It is one of the pre-Christian practices adopted by Christians. During the cold December darkness of Eastern Europe, the Germanic people gathered wreaths of evergreen and lit fires as signs of hope in a coming spring and renewed light. Christians kept these popular traditions alive, and by the 16th century Catholics and Protestants throughout Germany used these symbols to celebrate their Advent hope in Christ, the everlasting Light. From Germany the use of the Advent wreath spread to other parts of the Christian world.

Traditionally, the wreath is made of four candles in a circle of evergreens. Three candles are violet (or blue) and the fourth



could be rose (or pink), but four violet (or blue or white) candles can also be used. In our wreath there are four painted columns with lanterns on the top representing advent candles.

The Symbols

The Circle of the Wreath: God Himself, His eternity and His endless mercy, without neither beginning nor end

The Green of the Wreath: Our hope of newness, renewal and eternal life.

The Candles: The Light of God that came into the world through Christ to bring newness, life and hope. Four Candles: The four weeks of Advent, representing the four centuries between the time of the Prophet Malachi and the birth of Christ.

Three Coloured (purple or blue) Candles: A period of waiting, expectation and preparation.

The First Candle: A time of expectation and hope.

The Second Candle: The peace that is to come.

The Pink (or Rose) Candle: for the Third Week: It symbolizes joy for the promise is almost fulfilled.

The Fourth Candle: The love of God for mankind.



3 December - St Francis Xavier Born in 1506 in Navarre (Spain). Died on this day in 1552 off the coast of China. Met Saint Ignatius of Loyola (31 July) while studying in Paris, became one of the first Jesuits, and went to Goa (India) as a missionary. Travelled extensively through southeast Asia to Japan, winning many converts and leaving behind organised Christian communities. 
