Epiphany

The front page of the Catholic Weekly this week carries a story titled NEXT DOOR TO HELL. It is about a delegation of Australian Bishops visiting Syrian and Iraqi Christians who are made refugees by militant Muslims. Acknowledging and supporting the Christian faith of these people is very important at this time. The delegation of bishops from Maronite, Latin, and Coptic Churches assured the support of Australian Church to these displaced Christians. I am pleased that we too had an opportunity to be part of this mission. On the first weekend of December, our parish collected \$1049 in an exit collection for the delegation to take to the displaced Christians in the Middle East. This delegation was like the Magi (Three Wise Men) who visited child Jesus and acknowledged him as the Son of God. The displaced Christians are faces of Christ. Just as baby Jesus was deprived of the comfort of normal life and lying in a manger helpless. these Christians are feeling helpless and deprived of normal security of life, by Islamic militants. So the kind words of encouragement and the financial assistance the bishops took to them meant that they saw Christ in them. Therefore it was like the gifts of the Magi to child Jesus in Bethlehem which manifested Jesus as Christ to the world.

Children with disabilities and complex needs are also faces of Christ in our own community. Therefore the announcement of the opening of a Low-fee 'special school' for children with disability and complex needs at Lewisham is a delightful news. It was announced on page 3 of the Catholic Weekly. This is a new initiative of the Catholic Education Office of Sydney Archdiocese. I would say such a facility is another practical way of offering gift to Jesus Christ and announcing to the world that we see face of Christ in these children. I thought it is a wonderful mission for us as a parish to be part of. Therefore I have met with Dr Dan White, Executive Director of Catholic Education Office, to discuss some of the practical way our parish could contribute towards this new mission. Because we see face of Christ in the disabled children who are deprived of normal security of life. Like baby Jesus in the manger, these children could be reflecting the helplessness of concerned parents. I intend to have more discussions to see how to support this mission. After all we have a duty to proclaim to the world that we recognise face of Christ in these people.

Today is the feast of Epiphany; the feast of the manifestation of Jesus as God to the world by the three wise men (Magi). When the three Magi travelled to Bethlehem, they too were in search of God who could be touched, felt, and experienced. These men came from far and beyond the usual boundaries of the people of God, the Israelites. Our God has become near to people beyond any cultural boundaries. The Magi made offerings to the child Jesus and adored him as their God. The Magi's acceptance of Jesus as the expected Messiah, represents the universal acceptance of Jesus as the Saviour.

This feast challenges us to find practical ways of announcing manifestation of Jesus Christ as Son of God and Saviour to the world. We shall never be tired of finding the face of Christ in in the needy and announcing it to the world. May the New Year be full of such manifestations of Jesus as God and Saviour. May it be happy one through and through.
