Be Inclusive, Be Forthright

Bible Scholars agree on the fact that, unlike other prophets in the Bible, Jonah was not a historical person. But the book of Jonah is a story that reveals God's mind to the people God has chosen to be his own. A prophet is a person who accepts God's call to proclaim his Word and lead a life true to his call. That is how Isaiah, Jeremiah, Hosea, Amos, and other prophets were. But Jonah, as we read in the Bible, was a rebel who ran away from God's commissioning and only by compulsion he did the job of preaching God's message to the people of Nineveh. In fact it is a story ridiculing some of the popular prophets of that time who preached the superior standard of Israelites and promoted seclusion of them from the rest of the world.

The story of Jonah is a message against the particularization of the Jewish Israelites. Jews did not have much love for Assyrians. Centuries before they had conquered Samaria and took many of its tribes to Assyria and nothing had been heard of them since then. Therefore the Israelites naturally hated Assyrians. Nineveh was the capital of the pagan enemy country Assyria. No prophet would want to go there. No wonder Jonah went in the opposite direction to Nineveh when he was asked. But when at last he was compelled to go and preach there, Ninevites repented of their sins and undertook fasting and prayer to make up for it. This surprised Jonah who preached doom and gloom. When the Lord declared his compassion on these people it was a declaration that our God wants his people to go beyond the racial divide between Jews and Assyrian pagans. Even the historical enmity is not a reason to restrain from reaching out.

Deception, greed, arrogance, prejudice, anger and such sort of elements are not the kind of things we want in our lives. Yet, for the sake of inclusiveness we do not water down our faith and convictions. Jonah or God did not approve of all the sins and malice of the people of Nineveh. But, out of God's love for them, they were invited to repent for their sins. Once they opened their hearts to God, there was nothing stopping God from accepting them into his fold.

Christ and his salvation is for all peoples of the world. It is not to be constrained in any demographic boundaries. Therefore we should be welcoming people from all kinds of backgrounds with open arms. But it does not mean we need to approve of their sins and wrong attitudes. We should not be shy or timid to preach the good news of salvation. Jesus was not deterred by the arrest of John the Baptist. When the authorities who were troubled by the preaching of John arrested him, Jesus was more forthright in telling the people that the "Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Good News." He even went on to establish a team of apostles to help him in his ministry. Let us also team up with Jesus to proclaim the good news to the world.


