Second Sunday of Lent Year B 1 March 2015

Mountain Tops

Mountain tops give a clearer and wider view. Readings on this Second Sunday in Lent are providing us with a clearer and wider view of spiritual nature. Today's Scripture readings at Mass are about mountain-tops. Last week we were invited to a desert experience with Jesus. This week we are invited to mountain tops for a clearer view of who Jesus is.



The first reading from the Book of Genesis is about Abraham, our Father of Faith, going up Mount Morriah. Abraham was a man of great faith who was called out of Chaldea (part of present day Iraq). But he was still carrying the cultural and religious baggage of Chaldea, his homeland. Child sacrifice was one of them. So to show his trust in God he went up Morriah to sacrifice his own son. But God gave him a clearer view and understanding of God's mind. God revealed to him that he does not want any human sacrifice. So Abraham was called to leave the past behind and start a new life of Spiritual enlightenment. Through the mountain experience on Morriah, just as Abraham was given a clearer view of God's mind, we are provided with a clearer vision of Abraham as a man who totally trusted in God and a new way of life.

The second reading which is from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans, is about Mount Calvary. On this mount we get a clearer vision of the extent of God's love for us. His love extended to Jesus, the Son of God, sacrificing his life on the Cross for our sins.

The third Mountain for today's reflection is Mount Tabor. It is about 20 km northwest of where Jesus lived with Peter, in Capernaum. In the course of teaching his disciples to carry out his mission of preaching the Kingdom of God, Jesus took three chosen disciples and went up Mount Tabor. For the Israelites it was the mountain from which a beacon of light was sent out to the villages announcing the beginning of feasts. Since they followed the lunar calendar for religious feasts, it was important for religious leaders to announce that they have seen the moon and it is ok to start the celebration. At a time where no megaphones or telephones or internet were available, the most efficient way of communicating was to have a light house on the top of a mountain to send signals to the people in the valley.

Mount Tabor provided a vision for his leading disciples about who Jesus was. Through his transfiguration Jesus himself became the beacon announcing the time to celebrate. The disciples heard God revealing to them, "This is my Son, my beloved. Listen to Him". Though the disciples were taught by Jesus on their way to Tabor, they were given a clearer vision and understanding of who Jesus was through the experience on the top.

Standing with Jesus, the disciples could also see Moses, who was given the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai, and Elijah who met God on Mount Carmel. From the top of Mount Sinai, God told Moses how to guide and lead the Hebrew people and make them a people loved by Him. Elijah on Mount Carmel showed the people that his God is real and much more powerful than their god Baal. From those two mountains, the two giants of the Old Testament have now come to Mount Tabor to be with Jesus, Son of God. Now the disciples vision is clearer and they know that the Laws of Moses and the Prophecy of Elijah are to be seen hereafter in the light of Jesus, the Son of God.

In this Lent, whatever mountain top we are on, we should have a clearer vison about who Jesus is. Jesus is the centre of God's revelation to us.

The Sacrament of First Reconciliation will be celebrated on 10 & 11 November 2015. Enrolment details and date for the parents meetings for First Reconciliation will be announced later.

Preparing children for the Sacraments is primarily the duty and joy of the parents. Participation in Sunday Mass is an essential part of preparation for the reception of the Sacraments. Your Parish Priest, Parish Community, and the Parish School are willing to help you.

Karen – choosing food for life

Karen is a First Australian living in a remote rural community. Like many she can't always afford or access healthy food. At the Centacare Wilcannia-Forbes Manage Your Income, Manage Your Life Program, supported by Caritas Australia, Karen gained the skills she needed to budget and choose healthy food for her family.

For the majority of Australians, good health and great food are part of everyday life. But the story is starkly different for First Australians living in rural

communities, where low incomes, limited access to nutritious, affordable food, and poor food choices (due to lack of education) are severely compromising the health and well-being of families.

In Central New South Wales, sole mother-of-six Karen had limited education in life-skills such as money management, cooking, nutrition and health. Food and groceries in remote communities like Karen's are expensive due to freight costs and limited local competition. As a result, it was very hard to stretch her Centrelink payments to afford essentials like food and rent.

"I was in a lot of debt and wasn't handling my money properly," says Karen. "Feeding the kids was about what was easiest, not what is healthy."

Karen had never linked good budgeting habits to good food, good health and a better (less stressful) life. So, two years ago, when she enrolled in the Centacare Wilcannia-Forbes Manage Your Income, Manage Your Life Program supported by Caritas Australia, a new world opened up to her. Through a series of budgeting workshops and monthly budget planning sessions, combined with nutrition workshops and cooking activities, Karen gained the tools she needed to take control of her money and budget so she could provide regular, healthy food for her family.

Centacare also introduced Karen to the Food Support Program, where people on low incomes can buy affordable groceries and make their dollars go further. Taking control of her finances, and learning a new range of life-skills has given Karen the ability and confidence to choose foods for a healthier life that will lead to a better future for her family.


