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Second Sunday of Easter Year B Divine Mercy Sunday 12 April 2015

Learn from Thomas, Bear Witness to the Risen Christ

Today's Gospel reading is an interesting one. It is about Jesus appearing to his disciples after his resurrection. According to John the Evangelist, the first time resurrected Jesus appears to the disciples is in the absence of Thomas, and Jesus appears again a week later to the disciples including Thomas. Hearing that Jesus appeared to his companions in his absence, Thomas was naturally upset. Therefore he said that he will not believe without Jesus showing himself with the marks of crucifixion. It was more of an expression of a loving friend's wounded feelings than Thomas doubting the resurrection of Jesus. It is made clear by the expression of Thomas a week later when Jesus appeared to him along with the other disciples. Thomas this time did not ask for proof or a sign. He simply exclaimed, "My Lord, My God". (Peter is the only other disciple to make such a profession of faith that Jesus is Lord.) From Thomas' part, this was the expression of an ecstatic joy of a very dear friend. What is written in John 11:8-16 also confirms the bonding and commitment Thomas had for Jesus. The context is the death of Lazarus. When Jesus initially did not hurry to Bethany to visit his sick friend Lazarus, the disciples concluded that it was because Jesus feared that the Jews would kill him if he appeared in Bethany. Later when Jesus announced that he was going to Bethany, no disciple had as much courage as Thomas to say "Let us all go with the teacher that we all may die with him" (Jn 11:16). This shows that contrary to the common saying "doubting tom", Thomas was a man of great faith and affection for Jesus. He was also a courageous disciple. While all the other disciples locked themselves indoors for fear of the Jews, Thomas was the only one who had the courage to go out. Also Thomas was the only disciple to go out of the Roman imperial world, to India, to preach the Gospel. Not even Paul travelled this far from his homeland.

John the Evangelist, who reflected on the Gospel of Jesus for about 6 decades before his Gospel was written, makes one more point. By the time of John's Gospel, the disciples who had personally met Jesus were dying out. Therefore it was necessary to highlight the importance of missionary work of the people who may not have seen Jesus. Therefore John highlights what Jesus told Thomas, "You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe." Yes the age has come when we could not cling to the physical person of Jesus as was the case with the immediate disciples. This should remind us of what resurrected Jesus told Mary, "Do not cling to me" (Gospel of Easter Sunday morning Mass).

Today is also Divine Mercy Sunday and a reflection on the marks of the wounds on the body of the resurrected Christ is enlightening. Jesus kept the marks of the nails and the wound on his side as his ID. It reminds us that there is no resurrection and new life without the pain of the cross. Each of you may have stories of a wounded past. Such wounds and scars of the past may strengthen our witnessing to the risen Christ. Your suffering or pain of the past, your faith which brought you out of the fallen-ness, and your new life in Jesus will be the witness to the risen Christ in our world. Nothing else will be as powerful as a witness to Easter as such a combination. We will also have the peace of Christ Risen. We will be able to offer the same peace to others who need the peace of Christ Risen.

Jesus who breathed the Holy Spirit on the disciples is also filling our lives with the same Holy Spirit. So filled with the Spirit of God let us be witness to the resurrected Christ with a courage and devotedness like Thomas the Apostle. Let us also remind ourselves that, as people who have not seen Jesus and yet believed, we too are blessed. May the peace of Easter be with you always.
