

## **Ascension of the Lord**



had continued to appear to them and tell them about the Kingdom of God" (Acts 1:3). Then Jesus went up to heaven. The natural presence of Jesus to his disciples was taken away, in a way similar to what happened at his death. But it was to commence a new beginning. At Easter, he disappeared from the human world though his death, but commenced a new beginning though his resurrection. The natural presence of Jesus is once again taken away at his ascension, but only to commence something new. In the days after the ascension the natural presence of Jesus was constituted by his disciples. Then it was up to his disciples to be Jesus Christ to the world. They were to do what Jesus did, preaching the Good News about the Kingdom of God. "Jesus showed himself to the Eleven (Apostles), and said to them, 'go out to the whole

world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised

will be saved;" (Mark 16:15-16). The Apostles and other baptised faithful maintained the natural presence of Jesus Christ in the world by continuing the work of Jesus – extending the Kingdom of God by what they said and did. They preached the Good News of the Kingdom. They celebrated the Eucharist as Jesus had commanded them. After the time of the Apostles, this same work of extending the Kingdom of God is continued by their disciples. This process has continued till today and will continue hereafter. Now it is 'you and me', the baptised faithful, who are to continue the natural presence of Jesus Christ in this world. We do work on extending the Kingdom of God. We continue to do what Jesus commanded his disciples to do, including the Eucharist.

Just as Jesus showed compassion to the needy, we too help the needy through charity like participation in the Nepal Earthquake Appeal, Charitable Works Fund appeal, and so on. Following the miraculous feeding of the multitude in the wilderness and the Breaking of Bread at the Passover feast, we too come together on Sundays to nourish ourselves with spiritual food. I have been keen to publish my homilies, to organise Bible Study programs, Catholic Inquiry Program, and other Adult Faith Formation programs, to continue the teaching mission Jesus left to his disciples. In fact the Church exists to extend the Kingdom of God on earth by being the natural presence of Christ to the world. So let us not be complacent and be satisfied by attending church and saying personal prayers. Let us be true missionaries of the Gospel of Christ and a true presence of Christ to others naturally.

# Feasts of the Week.

24 May - Pentecost Sunday This, the "fiftieth day," concludes the season of Easter, the continuous single festival of the risen Christ. Pentecost, the Jewish feast of harvest, which also commemorates the giving of the Law of Moses, was the day when the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles (see Acts 2:1ff). The event has been celebrated on this day at least since the third century. The joy of Pentecost is that the risen Christ breathes upon the Church and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit" (John 20:22).



Pentecost is often called "the birthday of the Church." On this day, with the descent of the Holy Spirit, Christ's mission is completed, and the New Covenant is inaugurated.
