

Stormy Sea and Messing with Marriage

While a storm was scaring the hell out of the disciples in a boat, Jesus was comfortably sleeping in it. The alarmed disciples woke their master and saw him calming the sea and the storm with his 'word' - 'Quiet now! Be calm!' It reminded the disciples, who were of Jewish upbringing, of the power of Jesus equating the power of God who created the world out of the chaos of the water. That is what we read in the Book of Genesis. The sea was always considered a symbol of chaos. God brought order and life from the chaos, according to the creation narratives in Genesis. Similarly Jesus was bringing a new order and new life through his mission. The calming of the sea was indicative of Jesus' power to do so.



The turbulent sea these days is perhaps the debate over the meaning of marriage and political parties wanting to With Marriage mess with marriage. Sometimes we wonder in all this media hype and discussion, is our Lord sleeping without any care. Then again, the real presence of Christ in our time is you and me who make up the Body of Christ. So we need to wake up and command the 'stormy sea' of destructive lobbies for 'same sex marriage.'

One view of marriage is that it is nothing more than a commitment to love. On this view, marriage is essentially an

emotional tie, enhanced by public promises and consensual sexual activity. The marriage is valuable as long as the good emotions last. Proponents of this view of marriage argue that given that men and women, men and men, and women and women can have these sorts of emotional ties and all such unions should be recognised as marriages.

What they have missed out is that marriage is more than just an emotional union. It involves substantial bodily and spiritual union of a man and a woman. As the Old Testament taught and Jesus and St Paul repeated, marriage is where man and woman truly become "one flesh" (Gen 2:24; Mt 19:5; Eph 5:31). It is a comprehensive union between a man and a woman grounded on heterosexual union. Children are the natural result of marital life and are best reared within the commitment of marriage. This makes marriage an essential part of the propagation and nurturing of the human family.

What I have been telling you is taken from the pastoral letter of the bishops and it is time that all Catholics understand the stance of the church on this crucial topic. Monica Doumit, coordinator of Catholic Talk, will be speaking on this topic to a group of interested young people from the parish on Friday 24 July in the Jubilee Hall.



Feasts of the Week.

22 June - St John Fisher & St Thomas More: John Fisher: Born at Beverley (England) in 1469. Died at London on this day in 1535. Chancellor at Cambridge and bishop at Rochester, combining diligent pastoral ministry with the defence of Catholic doctrine. Thomas More: Born in London in 1478. Died there for the faith on 6 July 1535. An Oxford

scholar, a noted humanist and apologist, an incorruptible judge and Lord Chancellor, a devoted husband and loving father.

Drawn into conflict with Henry VIII, both were imprisoned and beheaded for treason. Remembered for their wide learning, for their devotion to the Church, and for their uncompromising integrity and courage. An opportunity to celebrate all the English martyrs, Catholic and Protestant, of the Reformation era. Coming from every walk of life, people rich and poor, married and single, women and men died on the scaffold, perished in prison, or suffered harsh persecution for their faith.

24 June - The Nativity of St John the Baptist This feast was observed on this date in the fourth century. It celebrates the holy birth of "the greatest of all the prophets," the one who leapt for joy in his mother's womb, who prepared the way for Christ, announced his presence, and baptised him in the Jordan River.
