Raising Jairus' Daughter

In 2011, I went to visit little Clare, a 3 year old child, from Culburra beach in Nowra. She is a little miracle. Why? One evening, earlier in that year, Peter, her dad, was sitting behind the wheel of the 20-seater bus the family used to transport their 11 children about Culburra. Peter told the story. "I was in a queue for petrol and someone cut in front of me. To stop anyone else doing the same thing, I rolled forward. That's when people started screaming and banging on the windows," Peter says remembering the horror of the moment when he leapt out of the bus and saw that his youngest child had slipped out of the vehicle and was now wedged under the bus's rear wheels. "She was lying underneath the two back wheels. I had stopped the bus right on top of her." Convinced he had killed her, Peter reversed the vehicle off her and then raced to gather his daughter in his arms. "That's when I started praying and never stopped," he says. Little Clare was rushed to Shoalhaven Hospital. Sue, Peter's wife, held Clare, who was conscious and together they kept saying over and over: "Jesus, I trust in you, Jesus I trust in you". That night Clare was airlifted to Randwick Children's hospital, where the doctors



told them that the next 12 hours would be critical. But the family trusted in God and kept up their prayer. In the morning when the doctor inspected the child, he could not find any damage to her body except a little bruising on one of her legs. Clare was all healthy and ready to go home. When I met Clare, she was playful like any normal child. Miracles do happen, even today.

In the case of little Clare, the faith and trust of her parents in Jesus Christ played a great part. The Gospel according to Mark today speaks of Jesus raising the 12 year old daughter of Jairus, a Synagogue official. Jairus believed in Jesus and knew that Jesus could heal the sick. But Jesus proved that he had power over even death by raising the little girl back to life. It is interesting that when people told Jesus that the child was dead and there was no more hope, he told them, "have faith" and do not feel hopeless. It is also noteworthy that Mark makes special mention of three disciples, - Peter James and John - with Jesus when the miracle happened. The miracle of raising of the child was for the faith formation of these disciples.

Mark also reports the healing of a woman with a haemorrhage. When the woman touched Jesus, she was healed. But Jesus made sure that this healing was made public by asking for her to identify herself. Once the woman came forward, he told her "your faith has restored you to health." Once again it was to provide a faith formation for the disciples and other followers.


That might explain, though we still see some miracles happening, why not all prayers for healing are answered. If we see any miracle happening, know that it is meant to strengthen us in our faith. But we do not need to wait for a miracle to work on strengthening our faith. We should constantly be aware of the need for strengthening our faith and use all opportunities to do so. A schedule of regular prayer and attending Bible Study programs are helpful in faith formation. Let us never lose our trust in Jesus Christ who can provide a new life for us.




Holy Father's Annual Appeal



Feasts of the Week.

29 June - St Peter & St Paul: Died as martyrs at Rome under Nero, between 64-67. This pre-eminent feast day of the city of Rome has been observed on this date since the mid-third century. It commemorates the martyrdoms of Peter the "chief of the apostles" and Paul the "apostle to the Gentiles". Remembered for their faith, their courage, and their leadership during the difficult days of the birth of the Church

3 July - St Thomas called the "Twin," was one of the twelve chosen by Jesus. Remembered for his initial disbelief in the resurrection and his subsequent proclamation of faith upon seeing the resurrected Christ: "My Lord and my God" (John 20:28). An early tradition venerates him as the Apostle of India.


