Familiarity, Mystery, and Faith

Last Thursday evening I was at the launch of The Catholic Guy Impact Centre in the Wollongong diocese. In the fover, along with the name tag I was given a sealed envelope marked 'DO NOT OPEN'. The envelope remained a curious mystery till Bruce asked us to open it towards the end of the program. After all, it was only a card for me to write the name of a person needing prayer. But by keeping it in a sealed envelope, it managed to generate extra interest in the whole process and bring extra attention to aspects of intercessory prayer. Like a wrapped gift, mysteries in life are more fascinating than the familiar. On the contrary, familiarity may breed contempt. Today's Gospel narrates such a situation in the life of Jesus. He went back to his home town of Nazareth to proclaim the good news of the Kingdom of God. But the people there were not much impressed with him, because he was too familiar to them. Yet Jesus did not think of adding a bit of mystery to his preaching to gain acceptance from his home people. If he was to use Hebrew to preach, instead of Aramaic, he could have added some mystery to attract his home people. But he refused to do so. He kept up his teaching in the language of the common people, Aramaic. He did not prefer Greek either, which was the elite language of the business class. He did not dress up like a Pharisee or a Scribe. In his teachings he did not quote the scholars on the scripture. He rather used stories and examples from the ordinary life of the people around him to explain aspects of the Kingdom of God. Jesus was prepared to risk losing his home people rather than put on aspects of mystery. He wanted to make it clear that faith is not the experience of awe and wonder at the face of any mystery but a personal relationship with him as the Son of God, just as his personal relationship with the Father in heaven. In the formation of the Apostles his emphasis was also more on the personal relationship with him rather than academic training. Regard for the person of Jesus is faith. Faith is not a belief in a particular philosophy or the practice of any particular traditional rituals.

Yet an appetite for elements that evoke a sense of mystery is still prevalent in our times too. There are people who would rather have Mass in Latin than the colloquial language they can understand. There are people who would like to see their priest always dressed in black with roman collar. We hear some people referring to nuns in habits as the 'real nuns' opposed to the ones who dress up like ordinary people and do the mission of the Church. Yet what is needed is a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and his representations around us. Your parish, as part



of the universal Church, is the presence of Christ to you. Therefore a personal relationship with your parish priest and other parishioners, who are embodiments of the person of Jesus Christ, is the practical way to grow in


faith. With such a fellowship, when we pray to God, we will be blessed with his grace. If the familiarity with your priest and other parishioners is an obstacle for you to connect with your parish, then it is time to rethink your faith commitment. Christian faith is not a belief in some philosophical system or the experience of awe and wonder at some mystery. It is the personal relationship with Christ. And Christ is present to us through our fellow Christians and your pastor, the Parish Priest. Let us keep working on growing in our Christian Faith.




Monthly Dinner

Children's Liturgy

Children's Liturgy at St Peter Chanel is popular. The purpose of this Liturgy is to present the Word of God part of the Mass at a level children can understand and appreciate. Therefore children aged between Kindergarten to First Communion are taken out of the church after singing the Gloria. They go to a place in the Parish Hall set up with table, crucifix, two candles and a Bible. After reaching there, the Gospel acclamation (Alleluia) is sung

and the Gospel is read. Then the children sit down and a short explanation is given about the Gospel message. The presentation of the message may also involve using craft work or drawings and paintings as per suggestion in the guide book. Once again the children stand up to join in professing a simple form of Creed. After the creed, they are encouraged to pray for various needs. This could be an extempore prayer which does not require prior preparation. Then the leader concludes the prayers of the faithful with short prayer. The children are than brought to the church to carry bread and wine to the altar for the offertory and join in the Eucharistic part of the Mass. It will be good to have a few more volunteers to help with Children's Liturgy. Anyone willing may leave the contact details with the parish office.

Feasts of the Week.

11 July - St Benedict: was born in Nursia, Italy and educated in Rome .In about 530 he began to build the monastery that was to be the birthplace of Western monasticism. Disciples flocked to him as his reputation for holiness, wisdom, and miracles spread far and wide. St Benedict prescribed common sense, a life of moderate asceticism, prayer, study, and work, and community life under one superior. He stressed obedience, stability, zeal, and had the Divine Office as the centre of monastic life. While ruling his monks he counselled rulers and Popes and ministered to the poor and destitute about him. He died at Monte Cassino on March 21.
