# **Missionary**

Amos is considered as one of the minor prophets in Bible study. But he was a man with great a vision for Israel. In his time Israel was divided into 2 different kingdoms – the fertile northern half was known as Israel, and the southern part, including Jerusalem, was called Judea. Amos was from the Jerusalem area, but he was directed by God to announce God's displeasure with the northerner's disregard of the poor and the precepts of the Lord. Their prosperity was going to their head. Amos addressed the northerners soon after king Jeroboam II's victory over the Arameans of Damascus. So the people of Israel were feeling invincible. But Amos warned them that if they do not repent for their injustice to the poor people, and follow the precepts of the Lord, the Lord will punish them. This message was not received well by the northerners. The priest of the temple in their capital city, Bethel, spoke for their King and said, "Go away seer; get back to the land of Judah; earn your bread there, do your prophesying there. We want no more prophesying in Bethel; this is the royal sanctuary, the national temple." (Amos 7:12-13). The allusion is that for Amos, prophesying was a job to earn money. He told them, he never wanted to become a prophet or come to Bethel. He did it only because of the commissioning from the Lord. He was happy with his job of shepherding and the seasonal work of tending the sycamore trees back home. (Ref Amos 7:14-15). About a decade later, the Assyrians started to invade the northern kingdom. Eventually the Jewish kingdoms fell to the Assyrians. So the prophesy came true. The Jewish kingdom was too proud of their prosperity and the rich had contempt for the poor. That is what brought such a collapse for them. It is a message for us too; do not to rely too much on our prosperity and neglect the poor and the precepts of the Lord. Just as the prophet Amos was not welcome into the prosperous Bethel, if the missionaries of out time are not made welcome, we will miss out on the message they bring from God.

Jesus sent his disciples in pairs to preach the good news of the Kingdom of God, to heal the sick, and to drive away evil. They were not allowed to take any provisions with them except an aid for the journey, a walking stick. The congregation to whom they were preaching were to provide for them. Whether the people provided for the missionaries or not was a test to see whether they welcomed them. If they were not welcome, they were to walk away from them, because without people's acceptance of the message, nothing could be done by the missionary. It is true even for the special commissioned disciples of the Lord.

What are the ways we as a parish community can make the bearers of God's Word welcome? Think about it.

We as Christians are also missionaries of the Gospel. Just like the disciples of Jesus we too are not to expect a hundred percent success in our mission. Be prepared for rejection. Rejections are not failures; they are openings to new beginnings. Therefore do not succumb to rejections as weakness or failures. Each time we experience rejection, we are strengthened and prepared by God for a new beginning with better results.




# **Change of Mass Schedule**


