



Real Food and Real Drink

We are defined by our choices. The primary instinct in most of us is to be rich and famous. Looking at the world we decide that we have to be millionaires. We want to win every race. In this rat race of life, we hang out with the kind of people who provide appetite for us to become millionaires and incentives to win every race. It might take a downfall or an infirmity to realise that one has been hanging out with losers. By then you might have already become a loser. Then one realises how quickly the wealth and fame are taken away. Then one learns what is important in life. That is when one understands how precious the gift of life is. Life is to be nourished by real food and real drink. John in today's Gospel is telling us about the real food and the real drink which is provided by someone who really loves us. Love is just a word until someone gives it a meaning. And Jesus has given it a whole new meaning. The last three Sundays we heard how much Jesus loved us and to feed from the real food and the real drink Jesus provides. Today we heard it again. We will hear it again next week.

The celebration of the feeding on real food and real drink that can nourish real life is called Eucharist. Therefore the Sunday Gathering for the Mass is not an optional extra to fill in when there is nothing else to do. It is important to feed your children with the real food and real drink that can provide real life – a life with proper meaning and unfailing purpose. Your love for them will find meaning when you can introduce them to the one who gave meaning to it beyond all flimsy definitions. It is the sacrificial love of Jesus that gave proper meaning to the word love. Therefore "leave your folly and you will live." (Proverbs 9:6). Eucharist is the source and summit of our spiritual life.

Feasts of the Week.

20 August - St Bernard: Born near Dijon (France) in 1090. Died at Clairvaux on this day in 1153. Joined the impoverished, reformed abbey of Citeaux at the age of 21. Soon became the founder and abbot of Clairvaux and pioneered the reform and expansion of the Cistercian Order. A prolific writer on theology and spirituality, an eloquent preacher, and an adviser of popes and kings. Remembered as the most influential churchman of his age, for his

inspirational leadership, and for his devotion to the humanity of Christ and to the Blessed Virgin.

21 August - St Pius X: Born Giuseppe Sarto at Riese (Italy) in 1835. Died at Rome on 20 August 1914. Elected pope in 1903, after being bishop of Mantua and patriarch of Venice. In pursuit of his motto, "to renew all things in Christ", he initiated reforms of the liturgy and of canon law and took stern measures against "modernist" trends in theology. His efforts to avert world war were frustrated. Remembered for his poverty and for his promotion of liturgical participation, especially of frequent communion, to which he admitted young children.



14 August - The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

This feast was established by Pius XII in 1955 and was celebrated on 31 May. Since 1969 it has been observed on 22 August to stress its relationship to the Assumption (15 August): taken up into glory, Mary became queen of heaven and earth.


