Saints on Earth and Canonisation.

On this feast all Saints, I you may be interested to read about the process of canonisation and meaning of Saint.

The process of Canonisation starts with documenting the life and virtues of a holy person, and this cannot begin until 5 years after death. This waiting period insures that the person has an enduring reputation for sanctity among the faithful. It can be waived by the Supreme Pontiff, and has been done on two occasions. Pope John Paul II waived 3 years of the waiting period in the case of Blessed Teresa of Kolkatta, and Pope Benedict XVI waived all five years in the case of his predecessor, Saint Pope John Paul II.

Once a Cause has begun with permission from the Holy See, the individual is called a *Servant of God*. During this first phase must gather testimony about the life and virtues of the Servant of God. Also, the public and private writings must be collected and examined. The results and documents are communicated to the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints, and later to related authorities. Once the person's Heroic Virtues have been recognized by the Pope, they are called Venerable.

The next step before beatification is the approval of a miracle, evidence of the intercessory power of the Venerable Servant of God and thus of his or her union after death with God. A scientific commission must determine by accepted scientific criteria that there is no natural explanation for the alleged miracle. Then a theological commission must determine whether the miracle resulted through the intercession of the Servant of God alone. But in cases of martyrdom the miracle required for beatification can be waived - martyrdom being understood as a miracle of grace. With the Holy Father's approval of a Decree of a Miracle, the Servant of God can be beatified. With the beatification rite, conducted on the authority of the Holy Father, the Venerable Servant of God is declared Blessed, e.g. Blessed Teresa of Kolkatta.

A person who is declared Blessed may receive public veneration at the local or regional level, usually restricted to those dioceses or religious institutes closely associated with the person's life. "Public veneration" in this use of the term doesn't mean that it is done *in public*; rather, that it is an act done by the clergy, or delegated laity, *in the name of the Church* (Mass, Divine Office, images in churches etc.), even if done in private. On the other hand, "private veneration" means veneration by individuals or groups acting *in their own name*, even if done "in public."

After beatification, the Church looks for a second miracle before proceeding to canonization. The alleged miracle is studied by scientific and theological commissions. If satisfied by the process and the advice of his consultors, the Holy Father, by the Rite of Canonization elevates a person to the universal veneration of the Church. By canonization the Pope does not make the person a saint. Rather, he declares that the person is with God and is an example of following Christ worthy of imitation by the faithful. A Mass, Divine Office and other acts of veneration, may now be offered throughout the universal Church.

If the saint has some universal appeal he may be added to the general calendar of the Church as a Memorial or Optional Memorial.

Not all saints are canonised. There are plenty more saints in the presence of God. There are also living saints. Saint Paul in numerous places in almost all his letters calls devoted Christians as saints. (Ref Rom 1:7; 8:27; 12:13). Saintly life is the acknowledgment that God gifts us with the virtues that proclaim his presence in our lives. The beatitudes, as we hear in today's Gospel (Matthew 5:1-12) enumerates these virtues. There are four qualities in the Christian life which show our receptivity to the goodness of God. They are poverty of Spirit, gentleness, preparedness to mourn and hunger for justice. The other four qualities that demonstrate our preparedness to actively work for the extension of the Kingdom of God. They are gift of mercy, a single minded commitment to the way of God, without any ambiguity, and preparedness to create peace around us and to love the Lord without counting the cost. Thus all of us, who wishes to follow Christ, are called to be saints, starting from here on earth.



Feasts of the Week.

2 November - The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed This day of commemoration began early in the Middle Ages with annual prayers for the dead in monastic communities. Fixed on this day, it spread more widely after the tenth century and now ranks with the principal feast days in the liturgical calendar. Commonly known as All Souls, it expresses Christian faith in the communion of saints and our need to pray for one another in the Church, especially those souls in purgatory "who have been buried in their human imperfection".





4 November - St Charles Borromeo Born in Arona (Italy) in 1538. Died on this day in 1584 in Milan. Only twenty-two when he was appointed cardinal, secretary of state, and given the administration of the diocese of Milan by his uncle, Pius IV. Prominent in the final sessions of the Council of Trent during 1562-1563 and, at its end, was ordained presbyter, then bishop and became archbishop of Milan. Known for implementing the Council's reforms in liturgy, education, presbyteral formation, and diocesan organisation. Remembered as an exemplary and pastoral bishop and an ardent proponent of reform and renewal.

If you wish, you will be able to light a candle for the your dear departed souls during the Mass. The candles sold for this occasion are electronic candles and it will cost \$2 each.
