

Mercy and Justice, not Hate, is needed

Trump, presidential aspirant in the United States, is in the news these days for all the wrong reasons. He wants to ban Muslims from the USA. The majority of people in his own country and all over the world strongly condemned his comment. Why? Because, while citizens want their political leaders to ensure security of their country, they do not support any hate based strategies. All good people of the world want to base their life on principles of mercy and justice, not hate. For the same reason, the recent comments by Tony Abbott on Muslims also attracted a lot of criticism.

In this year of Mercy, our Holy Father is calling all to enter into God's mercy. In the face of the refugee crisis, terrorist attacks, and economic insecurity, trying for a life of mercy, justice, and charity can be challenging. Yet that is what the Gospel is demanding from the people preparing for the coming of God into their midst. Christmas is not just the birthday of Jesus, it is the celebration of God being with us - Emmanuel.

John the Baptist, preparing the way for Christ, asked the seekers of Christ to be just and merciful in their dealings. John told that the Messiah is about to appear, and people should be ready for God by putting their lives in order. It was time for them to put their faith into practice. This means their socio-political life should reflect their faith. It is time to work on a God centred life-style.

Tax collectors were told not to charge excess. But their agreement with the Roman authorities was to collect a given quota; whatever they could exact above the quota supplemented their normal pay. Their pay apparently was not much. That meant following John's advice would drive them into poverty.

Soldiers who did not use their armoured muscle were in danger of not being accepted by their colleagues on whom they depended in the battle. Their pay was low, their rations were poor and their morale shattered. To such a people John was telling them "no intimidation, no extortion. Be content with your pay." True discipleship of Christ is more than customs and rituals: it is a moral challenge, even at the expense of personal cost.



There are a number of people who have stepped out of the comfort zone to live a life worthy of their Christian faith in our time. One such example is Dorothy Bayliss, a Sister of Charity from our parish community who opted to go to South Sudan, taking God's mercy and charity to the downtrodden in one of the poorest and violent part of the world.

For many of us, it may not be practical to be that radical in their Christian life commitment. But we all need to make sure our life is fundamentally based on principles of mercy, justice, and charity. Prepare to receive Emmanuel, our God with us.
















SPC - SJW KIDS CAMP 14-16 JANUARY 2016

A Carmelite priest who joined Saint Teresa of Jesus (15 October) in the work of Carmelite reform and, despite opposition and imprisonment, organised the discalced Carmelites. Remembered for his mystical writings, which combine theology and poetry to describe the spiritual journey through darkness to union with God.
