Holy Family 2015

Baby Jesus, God with us, was born to Mary and Joseph, making up the Holy Family. It is a great gift of model to other human families. Though divine, baby Jesus was not immune to



persecutions. He had to be taken out of Herod's territory to spare his life. This reminds us of the thousands of Christians fleeing Syria, Iraq, and other parts of the Middle East to escape persecution. Therefore the observance of the feast of the Holy Family obligates us to be compassionate to the refugees and the persecuted.

The sanctity of the family and its basic structure is to be respected with utmost care. But there have been worrying developments in our country. Archbishop Julian Porteous was called to explain himself for publishing the bishops' teaching on marriage. In a culture much focussed on pushing the cause of same sex marriage, understanding and defending the importance of marriage as a natural and divine order to start a family is much more necessary than before. Marriage should be open to procreation, and children should have the right to grow up in normal families with a mother and a father. Sadly many marriages are breaking down for various reasons. This means that society needs to work on understanding the dynamics of family life amidst the pressures of modern culture. Defending the holiness of families is much more complex and laborious in this day and age.

Peace, joy, hope, and trust in God are divine gifts and they are fostered much better when and where family ties are maintained better. A sense of sacredness of families will generate a better understanding of bearing God's image among children. This truth is evident in rich and poor cultures alike. In fact the greater need of interdependency perhaps makes it easier for poorer people. But poor or rich we shall strive towards maintaining the sacredness of marriage and celebrating the holy families of God's children

Few families are perfect. Yet families today, big or small, in struggle or pain, are all places where love can still be shared. It is families that can primarily help us understand the formative value of pain and rejection, when that occurs from the rest of the world. If God chose to have a family for the full human realisation of his only Son, there is a good reason for us to root ourselves in families in our growth towards the divine.

Feasts of the Week.

28 December - Holy Innocents In an attempt to kill the child Jesus, Herod ordered the massacre of all male children, two years old and under, in and around Bethlehem. The Holy Innocents have been honoured as martyrs for Christ since the fourth century and their feast has been celebrated on this day since the sixth century. In remembering them, the Church laments the suffering and death of children everywhere and honours all who die in innocence.

1 January - Mary the Holy Mother of God Venerated as Mother of God from ancient times, the Virgin Mary was acclaimed Theotokos (God-bearer) in 431 by the Council of Ephesus, and commemorated on this day in Rome in the seventh century. Soon eclipsed by other feasts of Mary. Restored to the liturgical calendar in 1931, and to this day in 1969. Celebrates Mary's role in the mystery of the incarnation, enriches the octave of Christmas with a Marian perspective, and provides a solemn beginning to the New Year.



2 January - St Basil the Great & St Gregory Nazianzen Basil: Born about 330 at

Caesarea (Turkey). Died there on 1 January 379. First a hermit, then bishop of his native city. Remembered for his pioneering monastic rule, and for writings which developed the doctrines of the incarnation and of the divinity of the Holy Spirit.

Gregory: Born at Nazianzus (Turkey) in 329. Died there in 389. Also a hermit before becoming bishop of Constantinople. Remembered as the "Theologian" because of his wisdom and acumen in maintaining orthodox doctrine against the Arians.Basil and Gregory are commemorated together because of their friendship in life and their enduring influence on the Church, especially in the East.

3 January - Epiphany of the Lord The earliest Christmas feast, originating in the East in the third century and passing to the West in the fourth century. Celebrates the divine "manifestation" or "coming". In the East it commemorates the baptism of the Lord and in the West the visit of the Magi. The mystery of the incarnation is now revealed to everyone in the world, represented by these wise men from foreign lands.


