You are the Light of the World and the Salt of the Earth

Sienna, Angelina, and Antony Abdallah and their cousin Veronique were killed in an accident a week ago. Our condolences to their parents as they grieve for the loss of their dear children. Leila and Danny Abdallah who lost three of their children were raising three little saints who have joined the ranks of the angels in heaven. These children, as part of Charity Team Jesus, were heavily involved in the group's weekly feeding of the Blacktown area's homeless population. They not only served the food with a smile, they insisted on praying for the people whom they served. Leila and Danny were not raising ordinary children. These children were brought up to live out the beatitudes we read in the Gospel of Matthew. These children showed how to be poor in spirit, how to be gentle, how to be merciful. But what their mother Leila told the media showed the crown of the Gospel values they lived out. She said, "I can't hate him (the drunken driver). That is not who we are. I forgive him." These amazing words are such an enlightenment for the world which struggles to fathom the depth of faith real disciples of Jesus have. Jesus said, "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lampstand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way, your light must shine in the sight of people, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven." The Abdallah family, in what they did and said, showed how to be the true light of the world. Saint Paul, in his first Letter to the Corinthians, said that it is not his oratory or philosophical arguments that count, but personal knowledge of Jesus crucified. He went on to say that faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God. (Ref 1Cor 2:1-5) It is not enough to learn and to speak about the Gospel values; they need to be lived out in the real life. Then you will become the salt of the earth. If you cannot really live out your faith in Jesus, then your life is like salt that becomes tasteless. "It is good for nothing and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by people." (Mt 5:13). A true disciple is strong enough, even in the worst of adversities, to be the light to the world and the salt of the earth.

REFLECTIONS ON MATTHEW 5:13-16

Scriptural context – Following blessings

Today's gospel passage is one that is quite commonly quoted and relatively well known. When it is taken in isolation, it's very easy to forget that these words immediately follow the Beatitudes. The imperative for justice in the images of salt and light of the world becomes even clearer when we remember that these words follow the blessings on those who are poor; who mourn; who are merciful and fight for justice. Jesus has blessed all these who are least in the world and then charges the disciples to be salt and light for them.

Have you thought? – Affirmation or Challenge

The salt and light of the world passage is often used to affirm and encourage, but when Jesus tells his disciples – and us – to be salt and light of the world it is not so that they can draw attention and glory to themselves. The whole purpose of being salt and light is to lead others into right relationship with one another and with God. Whilst the translation we have clearly states that disciples are to be salt and light of the world, it is just as clear that the intention is that they/we be salt and light for the world.

Scriptural context – Following blessings

Gandhi, the great leader of the Indian independence movement, is credited with saying, 'You must be the change you want to see in the world.' He sought a life free from tyranny and violence and so led a movement of non-violent resistance. It's tempting to think that he may have been influenced by some of the teachings of Jesus because so much of his approach reflected Jesus' call for justice. The charge to be the light of the world that shines in the sight of all and sets an example for all is echoed succinctly in Gandhi's words.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK

Monday, 10 February - St Scholastica (Memorial)



Born at Norcia (Italy) about 480. Died near Monte Cassino in the 540s. Like Saint Benedict (11 July), her brother and by tradition her twin, she dedicated herself to God through the monastic life. Remembered for her part in establishing Benedictine monasticism.

Friday, 14 February - Sts Cyril & Methodius (Memorial)
They were brothers, born in
Thessalonika, became priests and in
863 were sent to Moravia as

Thessalonika, became priests and in 863 were sent to Moravia as missionaries, where they taught the gospels in the native tongue of the



people. Cyril invented an alphabet and translated the liturgy and much of the bible. Methodius was consecrated archbishop of Sirmium, where he was imprisoned for two years by German bishops for his continued use of the vernacular liturgy. Alongside St Benedict, Saints Cyril and Methodius were declared patrons of Europe by Pope John Paul II.

Let us understand the workings of God's grace

An explanation of Paul's letter to the Galatians by Saint Augustine (AD 354-430)

Paul writes to the Galatians to make them understand that by God's grace they are no longer under the law. When the Gospel was preached to them, there were some among them of Jewish origin known as circumcisers – though they called themselves Christians – who did not grasp the gift they had received. They still wanted to be under the burden of the law. Now God had imposed that burden on those who were slaves to sin and not on servants of justice. That is to say, God had given a just law to unjust men in order to show them their sin, not to take it away. For sin is taken away only by the gift of faith that works through love. The Galatians had already received this gift, but the circumcisers claimed that the Gospel would not save them unless they underwent circumcision and were willing to observe also the other traditional Jewish rites.

The Galatians, therefore, began to question Paul's preaching of the Gospel because he did not require Gentiles to follow Jewish observances as other apostles had done. Even Peter had yielded to the scandalised protests of the circumcisers. He pretended to believe that the Gospel would not save the Gentiles unless they fulfilled the burden of the law. But Paul recalled him from such dissimulation, as is shown in this very same letter. A similar issue arises in Paul's letter to the Romans, but with an evident difference. Through his letter to them, Paul was able to resolve the strife and controversy that had developed between the Jewish and Gentile converts.

In the present letter Paul is writing to persons who were profoundly influenced and disturbed by the circumcisers. The Galatians had begun to believe them and to think that Paul had not preached rightly, since he had not ordered them to be circumcised. And so the Apostle begins by saying: I am amazed that you are so quickly deserting him who called you to the glory of Christ, and turning to another gospel.

After this there comes a brief introduction to the point at issue. But remember in the very opening of the letter Paul had said that he was an apostle not from men nor by any man, a statement that does not appear in any other letter of his. He is making it quite clear that the circumcisers, for their part, are not from God but from men, and that his authority in preaching the Gospel must be considered equal to that of the other apostles. For he was called to be an apostle not from men nor by any man, but through God the Father and his Son Jesus Christ.

Coronavirus

Archdiocesan Office has communicated with parishes the following message in relation to the current health emergency caused by the Coronavirus.

At this point, health authorities have said that the risk of exposure to the public is low, especially if they have not travelled to one of the affected areas, nor had contact with someone who has." Across the Church in Australia generally, and in the Archdiocese of Sydney in particular, there are as yet no mandated precautions beyond the common sense rule that people should stay home if they think they might be sick or infectious. Ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands with soap or hand wash before distributing the Body of Christ.

Parishioners who wish further to minimise the risk of transmission are free not to put their fingers in the holy water stoop, not to shake hands at the Sign of Peace, not to receive Holy Communion on the tongue (but only in the hand), and/or not to receive Holy Communion from the chalice.



The Church is going to be air-conditioned. We are also installing solar panels so that the air-conditioning will work on green energy. The system will include ducted split system air conditioning (\$34,800) and solar panelling (\$42,000). The total cost of the

project is \$76800. We have applied for a grant from MP's fund for part of the cost, though the success of the application is uncertain. Donations towards funding the project will be of great assistance.
