Father's Day and the Faith Family

On this Father's Day, I pray God's blessings on all fathers. Some of the men in the parental role may be faced with uneasy situations when the world around them is celebrating the gift of fatherhood. It could be due to hurting family relationships where there have been break ups, infidelity and incompatibility. Alienation from the family where one is meant to belong is not desirable. Ways of reconciling is the first thought that preoccupies anyone genuinely hurt. Taking life seriously, one would wait for avenues of reconciliation to be exhausted before parting. Matthew in his Gospel shows that this is true of the discipline in the Church at large.

Church gatherings of the Gospel times were small and could be equated to our parish Church. Our parish is our faith family. With the parish schools, ministries to the lonely, care for the elderly, Sacramental celebrations, and Eucharistic gatherings, the faith family of the parish work on being a family together just as any good family would do. Therefore, any member of the Church not complying with the expectation of the Church at large is a matter to be addressed. How do we do it? In the early Church the first step was a one on one approach where the dignity of the offending person was kept intact while attempting to reconcile with him. If it did not work a group of people would work together with him or her to win the offender back. Once again, notice that confidentiality was upheld to protect the dignity of the offender and keep it intact. If the offender was still too stubborn for any conversion, as a last resort, he or she was excluded from the faith family, the Church.

Just as in the early Church, in our times too, scandalous behaviour of the members are to be corrected. This may happen in moral or ethical matters. Priests, bishops and the pope himself could be initiating correctional activities. It is not only the ordinary lay members of the Church who can be scandalous and needing correction, the bishops and priests also could be in need of correction. In any such cases the Church has to undertake a process of winning back the person who is causing hurt and disunity. But in every process, it is important to respect the dignity of the offender. In our parish, let us keep working on being a good faith family. Unfortunately, the Church family will have to exclude those who are unwilling to be converted to be an integral part of the Body of Christ.

REFLECTIONS ON MATTHEW 18:15-20

Historical Context – Tell the Church

The idea of bringing a 'sinner' or offender before the church community to be confronted is one that the early Christians borrowed from the Jewish culture out of which they were formed. In Jewish society, the local synagogue was effectively a community centre. It was a gathering place, not only for worship and education, but also for meeting, debating and seeking solutions to problems. The synagogue community took on the role of mediator, witness, jury, judge and, if needed, punisher. The role of the scribes in Jewish society was to interpret the Law – the Torah – in resolving everyday situations.

Scriptural context – A Scriptural Sandwich

The placement of this discourse about confronting your brother within the gospel of Matthew helps to shed light on its meaning. Immediately preceding this passage is the parable of the Lost Sheep, about leaving the 99 to go out in search of the one lost sheep. Immediately following this week's passage is the parable of the unmerciful or unforgiving servant who, despite receiving forgiveness of his own debt from his master, throws a fellow servant in debtors prison for failing to pay back money owed. The three passages together give a detailed discourse on forgiveness and reconciliation – dealing with those who have sinned, even against you personally and the powerful call to compassion and mercy.

Living the Gospel – Facing the issue

It can be very difficult when we feel that someone has hurt us to actually go and speak to them about how we are feeling. It is so much easier to revel in our hurt or seek payback for the hurt. Sometimes we feel that we might ruin a friendship by speaking to our friend about a way in which they have hurt us. But a hurt that goes unaddressed will continue to hurt and will probably be repeated. This week's gospel reminds us of the need to challenge our friends when they hurt us but it also reminds us that when we have hurt others we need to be challenged about it and called to account for our actions.

Christian Wisdom

From a sermon on the Beatitudes by Saint Leo the Great (CE 400-461)

The Lord then goes on to say: *Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled.* This hunger is not for bodily food, this thirst is not for any earthly drink: it is a longing to be blessed with righteousness, and, by penetrating the secret of all mysteries, to be filled with the Lord himself.

Happy is the soul that longs for the food of righteousness and thirsts for this kind of drink; it would not seek such things if it had not already savoured their delight. When the soul hears the voice of the Spirit saying to it through the prophet: *Taste and see that the Lord is good*, it has already received a portion of God's goodness, and is on fire with love, the love that gives joy of the utmost purity. It counts as nothing all that belongs to time; it is entirely consumed with desire to eat and drink the food of righteousness. The soul lays hold of the true meaning of the first and great commandment: *You shall love the Lord God with your whole heart, and your whole mind and your whole strength*, for to love God is nothing else than to love righteousness.

Finally, just as concern for one's neighbour is added to love of God, so the virtue of mercy is added to the desire for righteousness, as it is said: *Blessed are the merciful, for God will be merciful to them*.

Remember, Christian, the surpassing worth of the wisdom that is yours. Bear in mind the kind of school in which you are to learn your skills, the rewards to which you are called. Mercy itself wishes you to be merciful, righteousness itself wishes you to be righteous, so that the Creator may shine forth in his creature, and the image of God be reflected in the mirror of the human heart as it imitates his qualities. The faith of those who live their faith is a serene faith. What you long for will be given you; what you love will be yours for ever.

Since it is by giving alms that everything is pure for you, you will also receive that blessing which is promised next by the Lord: *Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God*. Dear friends, great is the happiness of those for whom such a reward is prepared. Who are the clean of heart if not those who strive for those virtues we have mentioned above? What mind can conceive, what words can express the great happiness of seeing God? Yet human nature will achieve this when it has been transformed so that it sees the Godhead *no longer in a mirror or obscurely but face to face* – the Godhead that no man has been able to see. In the inexpressible joy of this eternal vision, human nature will possess *what eye has not seen or ear heard, what man's heart has never conceived.*

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK



Tuesday, 8 September - The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Feast)

This feast originated in Jerusalem about the sixth century, a development of the feast of the dedication of the church of Saint Anne, built in Jerusalem "where Mary was born". Observed in Rome in the seventh century, it was later used to determine the date of Mary's Immaculate Conception. Because of her importance in salvation history, Mary's birthday is celebrated as well as those of her son Jesus the Lord, and of Saint John the Baptist (24 June).

QR Code Check In






