PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD—YEAR B 28 MARCH 2021

Don't Park Your Religion, Enter the Kingdom of God

When the downtrodden and the persecuted soar, their stories bring about great hope and joy. Through the passion narratives of the Gospel, we can see that Jesus whom they tried to kill in a very shameful way is in fact the true life giver.

Jesus who entered Jerusalem, riding on a donkey through the eastern gate of the city showed the folly of the common belief of the time. Many thought the Messiah would be coming from the east as warrior king to the city of Jerusalem, the centre of religion for the Jews. But Jesus mounted on a donkey, the symbol of peace, and made a royal entry fitting for a ruler to the shouts of joy.

During the trial, Jesus revealed his divinity to the people around him who looked at him as a criminal. The more they tried to put down the life of Jesus, the greater was the fulfilment of the scriptures and prophesies. Thus when the worldly people thought things were going their way, ironically God's plan was being realised.

At the end of the passion narrative, we hear the centurion, a gentile, professing that Jesus is "indeed the Son of God". Thus the Gospel reveals that the Kingdom of God is now open to the gentile world. It is no more a monopoly of the Israelites. Another irony is that the Israelites as a rule has lost the Kingdom and the People of Faith from outside the confines of Israel has won the Kingdom big time.

In Jesus we see how God works in our lives. By showing God in the human person of Jesus we are invited to see the divine in the human life we all share. Persecution, rejection, and condemnation may seem to diminish the meaning of life and sense of hope, but looking through the prism of the passion of Jesus, you see how God turns your miseries into means living your life fuller. Therefore don't be downcast when others condemn you and try to make your life miserable. Keep up your passion for the Word of God and walk the way of the cross. Don't ever think of parking your life or religion. If you do, you don't get anywhere. But move on, looking at our Saviour who turned the shame of cross into a sign of glory. Live your life to a fuller measure and enter the Kingdom of God.



REFLECTIONS ON MARK 14:1-15:47

Gospel Focus – This man was a son of God

By the time we have stood and listened to this lengthy Passion narrative, the listener may have started to wilt by the time we get to the death of Jesus. Yet the gospel writer keeps one of the most important messages for this moment. As Jesus dies, a centurion standing by utters the inspired words, 'In truth, this man was a son of God.' Famously played by John Wayne in the movie, The Greatest Story Ever Told, the centurion is the voice of the gentile – the non-Jew – representing all those throughout the world who will recognise the truth of Jesus' life and purpose.

Have you thought? Passion of the Passion

The Passion narrative is very aptly named. The emotion and power of this story is nothing short of passionate. The gospel writer's style of fast paced, unadorned factual narrative is a very effective way of helping the reader/listener to engage in the story. It is, after all, the first half of the most important Christian story – finished off by the resurrection that is celebrated on Easter Sunday. It is easy to see why this stark, narrative style was embellished and expanded upon by the later gospel writers and yet it is perhaps the more passionate for the lack of explanation and theologising.

Living the Gospel – Before the cock crows

Peter is an interesting character in the gospels. He is one of the first of the disciples to be called; Jesus changes his name and places great trust in him; he is witness to the most significant moments of Jesus' life; he is able to profess his faith in Jesus as the Christ and yet it is he who denies even knowing Jesus. We might have thought that Peter was Jesus' most loval and faithful follower, yet it is he who can't stand up and claim that he was a follower of Jesus. Is it any wonder that it is difficult for us today sometimes?

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord Saint Andrew of Crete

Let us go together to meet Christ on the Mount of Olives. Today he returns from Bethany and proceeds of his own free will towards his holy and blessed passion, to consummate the mystery of our salvation. He who came down from heaven to raise us from the depths of sin, to raise us with himself, we are told in Scripture, above every sovereignty, authority and power, and every other name that can be named, now comes of his own free will to make his journey to Jerusalem. He comes without pomp or ostentation. As the psalmist says: He will not dispute or raise his voice to make it heard in the streets. He will be meek and humble, and he will make his entry in simplicity.

Let us run to accompany him as he hastens towards his passion, and imitate those who met him then, not by covering his path with garments, olive branches or palms, but by doing all we can to prostrate ourselves before him by being humble and by trying to live as he would wish. Then we shall be able to receive the Word at his coming, and God, whom no limits can contain, will be within us.

In his humility Christ entered the dark regions of our fallen world and he is glad that he became so humble for our sake, glad that he came and lived among us and shared in our nature in order to raise us up again to himself. And even though we are told that he has now ascended above the highest heavens – the proof, surely, of his power and godhead – his love for man will never rest until he has raised our earthbound nature from glory to glory, and made it one with his own in heaven.

So let us spread before his feet, not garments or soulless olive branches, which delight the eye for a few hours and then wither, but ourselves, clothed in his grace, or rather, clothed completely in him. We who have been baptized into Christ must ourselves be the garments that we spread before him. Now that the crimson stains of our sins have been washed away in the saving waters of baptism and we have become white as pure wool, let us present the conqueror of death, not with mere branches of palms but with the real rewards of his victory. Let our souls take the place of the welcoming branches as we join today in the children's holy song: *Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Blessed is the king of Israel*.

Year of St Joseph

Now we have plans to celebrate the Year of St Joseph in a solemn way. It was the main agenda of the last meeting of the Pastoral Council. On the Feast of St Joseph the Worker, Saturday, 1 May, all parishioners are invited to gather at St Joseph the Worker School premises. A new (life size) statue of St Joseph the Worker will installed in front of the school by then. At 4PM the statue will be unveiled and blessed. After the prayers in front of the newly installed image of Joseph, a procession will commence to our parish Church of St Peter Chanel. Another statue of St Joseph the Worker, the one we used to take out on the parish days, will be set up on a vehicle to be brought solemnly to the Church. All parishioners, including children and parents, who are able to walk the half an hour distance to the Church are invited to accompany the statue with banners and ceremonial umbrellas. We shall also have some drummers to accompany the walkers. Those who are not able to walk the distance can drive to St Peter Chanel. The statue in



procession will be transferred from the vehicle to be carried on shoulders from Jenkin Street junction of Kingsland Road. Upon the arrival of the procession to the Church, the solemn Mass will commence at 5PM. There will be a Dedication of the Parish to St Joseph during the Mass. After the Mass, everyone will be invited to a social gathering with food in the Parish Jubilee Hall.

A number of volunteers are required for the celebration. We are looking for drummers, volunteers to carry the statue, people to decorate the processional vehicle, and assist with the social gathering in the Hall. The food will be organised through caterers. Please contact the parish office to indicate your willingness to volunteer. Pope Francis on December 8, 2020 published an Apostolic Letter Patris corde (With a Father's Heart), commemorating the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of St Joseph", running from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021.



Good Friday Collection

The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land will take place on **Good Friday**, **2 April**. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment and housing. Parishes, schools orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land also rely on assistance from the Good Friday collection. It is also used to maintain 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus.



Last year, due to the global pandemic, it was an extremely difficult time for the Church and people of the Holy Land with very little income due to the lack of pilgrims and the closure of churches around the world. Despite this, Australian Catholics did manage to donate \$406,000 (compared to the \$1.3 million in 2019). This year, the Holy Land will continue to face and extreme shortfall in income due to the ongoing effects of the pandemic and so we are urging Catholics around the world to be as generous as possible. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land on Good Friday and please keep them in your prayers. Thanks!

To the people of the Church in Australia, for the Holy Land Collection 2021

For 800 years, Franciscan friars have shared the difficult lives of Christians in the often conflict torn countries of the Middle East, the most recent example being the civil war in Syria which began in 2011 and still remains unresolved. But as well as Syria, the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land includes Israel and Palestine, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Rhodes and Cyprus. The people of these countries face their own difficulties, particularly Christians due to their minority status. Among them, the friars offer pastoral care in parishes, provide vital educational and charitable works, and in addition, maintain the constant upkeep of the Holy Places of Christianity.

But 2020 has proved to be a year like no other. As in so many parts of the world, the COVID-19 Pandemic has created enormous challenges for the people of the Holy Land particularly in terms of health and a catastrophic loss of income due to travel restrictions preventing pilgrims, and the closure of all shrines. Pilgrimages to the Holy Land are a vital resource. The offerings that Pilgrims leave allow the Franciscan Friars and local Church to carry out their mission: from the care of the Holy Places that give work to the local community, to the running of several parishes, schools and the many social works that care for orphans, refugees, the homeless, and more.

Brothers and sisters, as the Holy Land Collection Statement of Income for 2020 shows, the disruption caused by the pandemic led to a collection last year of only one-third of a normal year in Australia. This loss has been repeated around the world, often much worse, and as things appear, it will again be the case in many countries in 2021. All this makes this year's Good Friday Collection extremely important. The hope is that as our life in Australia returns more to normal and our churches are open, Australian Catholics will be able to be as generous as they have been in past years. Please remember brothers and sisters that the Collection is a vital contribution and act of solidarity that the whole Church can make to support, through the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land, the Christian peoples of the Holy Land. These Christians trace their faith right back to Pentecost (Acts 2:10), and they still walk in the footsteps of Jesus, often in a seemingly endless Way of the Cross.

The solidarity that we Australian Catholics can make is not only with the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land, but also with the Latin Diocese of Jerusalem and with the six ancient Oriental Communities in the Middle East. Cardinal Leonardo Sandri, Prefect of the Congregation for the Oriental Churches, writes: "I am glad to transmit to all who work for the success of the Good Friday Collection, the deepest gratitude of the Holy Father together with my own gratitude and that of the Congregation for Oriental Churches."

Our Australian parishioners, Parish Priests and Bishops have always been most generous to the Holy Land (Good Friday) Collection. Our donation is a direct way to make a difference in the lives of those who are keeping alive the Christian presence in the land of Jesus often in the face of great odds, made all the more difficult now due to the terrible pandemic afflicting our world. On their behalf, may I humbly thank you all wholeheartedly.


