# **God is Relationship, Demands Loyalty**

Some years ago, in my homily to a group of high school students, I told the sad story of a lonely man found in an in inner city home. The body was not found until the stench of the decaying body disturbed the neighbourhood. For many weeks he was dead and no one missed him. Listening to this story I could see tears dropping from the eyes of the students. These students were well aware of the need to share life in its exuberance as well as in its barrenness. Without sharing, life is nothing. The more you are prepared to relate to others in love, the richer your life will be. The Bible reveals that our God by nature is total sharing.

God is not solitary, unable to share himself one. God is communion of loving relationships. Jesus Christ has revealed that God is a relationship between Father, Son and Holy Spirit: This unity of the three, Tri-Unity, we call Trinity. This is the image in which we human beings are created. Therefore, if we define the best human being as being a person totally autonomous, self-sufficient, not



dependent on others it is not a good thing. A good life has three dimensions. As a good Christian you build up a fellowship with others and with God. We celebrate this three-dimensional aspect of life when we come together as Christians to receive Holy Communion at the Altar.

Many are happy to be philanthropic, thus leading a two-dimensional life. Going a step further and making a fellowship with not only others, but also with God, your life will be more fulfilling. This happens in the context of a worshipping community. Even some of the regular Mass goers do not seems to get it right. They think by just attending Mass alone they are on the right path. To be true to a fellowship with God and others, you need to have loyalty to your worshiping community, your

parish. Turning to your church only on occasions when you feel the need to 'fill up', as you would do with your car at a fuel pump, does not adequately show the divine nature in you. Just as God is a trinity, total and mutual relationship between three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, you who are created in his image also should be loyal to the Father and the Body of Christ. On this feast of the Most Holy Trinity, ask yourself "What is my relation to the Father in heaven, and to Body of his Son, the Church? What place does the local parish have for me in my faith life?"

#### **REFLECTIONS ON MATTHEW 28:16-20**

Historical Context – I believe The word 'Trinity' does not appear anywhere in the New Testament although one can certainly see the beginnings of ideas about a Trinitarian God. It was not until 325, at the Council of Nicea, that the doctrine of the trinity was established as being orthodox teaching. This council sought to officially define the relationship between the Father and the Son as a response to the arguments of Arius (later known as Arian heresy). The statement of beliefs developed by this council in 325 is the Creed (credo = Ibelieve) that is used in Catholic churches around the world today.

#### Have you thought? Mystery

I always thought that to describe the Trinity as a 'mystery' was a bit Jesus' instruction that the disciples of a 'cop out' for not offering a decent explanation. However, a theological 'mystery' is defined as something that not only are we incapable of discovering except through divine revelation, but that even when its truth has been fully revealed, we are incapable of fully grasping it. Our understanding can never be any more than partial, even when we fully accept it. This is a concept with which our world struggles – that there is something that is not fully able to be known but it's OK not to fully understand

go out to all the nations and baptise them 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit' is an instruction that is still being carried on today. Those precise words are used by the priest at every baptism. They are also the words used in the sign of the cross – whether that is a personal, private blessing of oneself or a blessing of a group as in the introductory and dismissal rites as part of a Eucharistic celebration. When we make the sign of the cross we use the words of Jesus.

## Light, radiance and grace are in the Trinity and from the Trinity

#### A letter of St Athanasius

It will not be out of place to consider the ancient tradition, teaching and faith of the Catholic Church, which was revealed by the Lord, proclaimed by the apostles and guarded by the fathers. For upon this faith the Church is built, and if anyone were to lapse from it, he would no longer be a Christian either in fact or in name.

We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity there is no intrusion of any alien element or of anything from outside, nor is the Trinity a blend of creative and created being. It is a wholly creative and energising reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity of the holy Trinity is preserved. Accordingly, in the Church, one God is preached, one God who is above all things and through all things and in all things. God is above all things as Father, for he is principle and source; he is through all things through the Word; and he is in all things in the Holy Spirit.

Writing to the Corinthians about spiritual matters, Paul traces all reality back to one God, the Father, saying: Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in everyone.

Even the gifts that the Spirit dispenses to individuals are given by the Father through the Word. For all that belongs to the Father belongs also to the Son, and so the graces given by the Son in the Spirit are true gifts of the Father. Similarly, when the Spirit dwells in us, the Word who bestows the Spirit is in us too, and the Father is present in the Word. This is the meaning of the text: My Father and I will come to him and make our home with him. For where the light is, there also is the radiance; and where the radiance is, there too are its power and its resplendent grace.

This is also Paul's teaching in his second letter to the Corinthians: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all. For grace and the gift of the Trinity are given by the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. Just as grace is given from the Father through the Son, so there could be no communication of the gift to us except in the Holy Spirit. But when we share in the Spirit, we possess the love of the Father, the grace of the Son and the fellowship of the Spirit himself.

#### Monday, 31 May - The Visitation of the Blessed



Virgin Mary (Feast)
This feast celebrates the Virgin Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth, as told in the Gospel of Luke (Luke 1:39-56), and her example of faith in God's word and sensitivity to the Spirit. It was introduced into the Franciscan calendar by Saint Bonaventure (15 July) in the thirteenth century and

was extended in 1389 to the entire Latin Church to heal the divisions in the Western Church of the time.

#### Tuesday, 1 June - St Justin (Memorial)



Born about 100 at Nablus (Palestine). Died about 165 in Rome. After lengthy study of Greek philosophies, he acknowledged Christ as the source of all truth. A lay intellectual, Christian philosopher, and apologist. Remembered for his reasoned defence of Christian belief and practice and for the

ultimate witness given by his martyrdom.

# Thursday, 3 June - Charles Lwanga & Companions (Memorial)



Charles Lwanga and his companions were African catholics who died for their faith in Uganda in the 1880s. At the time Uganda was ruled by King Mwanga who persecuted Christians for their primary allegiance to God rather than their king. Charles Lwanga was the

head of the royal page boys, some of whom he had baptised. One day all the pages were assembled and the Christians were separated from the group and arrested. Charles and his companions, many only boys, were martyred for their belief. The example of these passionate young Africans inspired many people who then became converts to Christianity.

#### Saturday, 5 June - St Boniface (Memorial)

St Boniface was born in c.675 in Devonshire and



was educated at a Benedictine monastery. Ordained a priest at the age of thirty, Boniface became a missionary to Germany and in 722 was consecrated Bishop of Hesse. A popular story of his evangelisation tells of his encounter with a pagan tribe that worshipped the Norse god Thor in

the form of an oak tree. Boniface walked up to the ancient tree and cut it down with an axe, then stood on the trunk and said, "How stands your mighty god? My God is stronger than he." This led to widespread conversions and with the timber from the oak, he built a chapel dedicated to St Peter, Prince of the Apostles. He became an Archbishop in 732 and died in 754 after being attacked by a band of pagans while evangelising in Holland.

## CatholicCare Partnership with the Parish

I have always been looking greater and enhanced out reach for people in need of various assistance, like housing, domestic issues, mental problems, and such. I am pleased that now CatholicCare has a new initiative to partnership with Parishes in Sydney. So far Liverpool and Fairfield parishes have successfully established the pilot programs. I invited CatholicCare representatives to speak about the program to the first meeting of the Pastoral Council this year. Since then I have had a few more meetings with them. We are working on employing a trained person once a week in the parish. The goal of this program is seven fold.



- Break down barriers in understanding, accessing and navigating community support services
- Provide advocacy for people most in need.
- Increase community knowledge of support services.
- Reduce social isolation, meaningfully connect individuals, and help them become active participants within the broader community.
- Build the Parish's capacity to respond to those in need.
- Connect the parish to the wider community.
- Evangelisation through serving the community.

The parish will be soliciting grants and fundraising to finance this initiative.

This parish program will be taken to Pastoral Council and Finance Committee again for their advice. I hope that this Parish Program can be commenced in July this year. ~Fr Thomas
