OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

CHRIST THE KING

There is a little known fact about St Mary's Cathedral Sydney. It is a war memorial church and has a statue of an unknown fallen soldier in the nave! I was surprised to find it out many years ago. But it made sense later. Not one, but two, World Wars dominated the history, especially the western in the twentieth century. Hence there have been glorification of wars, erection of war memorials in city centre



Hence there have been glorification of wars, erection of war memorials in city centres, and dedication of churches to the memories human conflicts. Misguided patriotism and struggle for supremacy was at the heart of these major conflicts. Yet what we need is peace, joy, and prosperity, not destructions. In 1925, then Pope, Pius XI asserted that the most effective way of defence against the destructive forces of the age is to recognise Jesus Chris



defence against the destructive forces of the age is to recognise Jesus Christ as king, and the pontiff established the Feast of Christ the King. Jesus Christ is king, though a different sort.

John's Gospel presents Jesus as the King. "*Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?*" *Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born*" (*Jn 18:37*). To Pilate, a king meant regional ruler like Herod, appointed by the Roman Emperor. Therefore, Pilate could not acknowledge Jesus as king. What he did not know was that Jesus' kingship was not like Herod's or any other worldly monarch. The rule of Christ was non-violent. Humility, compassion, and love are the characters of Christ's rule. Jesus Christ did not load his authority over his subjects. As an ideal king he is always at our service.

Who do you think now represent Christ the King? It is not just pope and bishops that represent Christ the King. Every baptised person, through the anointing with Holy Chrism is formally set apart to represent Christ. Now look into your own life and see how you reflect Christ the King. You do not want to be in conflict with everyone like the war mongrels. What we want is a life of peace, joy, and prosperity for ourselves and others. Therefore, through your serviceorientated life, witness to the world that Christ is your king, and proclaim that he is the King of all.

REFLECTIONS ON JOHN 18:33-37

Gospel Focus – Truth

Jesus says to Pilate that he came into the world 'to bear witness to the truth: and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.' That is where today's gospel passage finishes but as the gospel continues on, Pilate famously asks Jesus 'What is truth?' and the question is left dangling; unanswered. The truth Jesus has borne witness to is the truth of his whole life – the revelation of God's love for humanity. It is for proclaiming this truth that Jesus is placed on trial and is brought before Pilate.

Historical Context – Christ the King

Unfortunately, political and military images of kingship have played a dominating role in the Church since very early in its history. The very earliest Christians, or followers of the Way, did not conform to social and political hierarchies of their day. But when Emperor **Constantine declared Christianity** to be the official religion of the Roman Empire the structure of the Church quickly adopted the political and social structures of the empire. At times in history the Pope has adopted a regal status and led huge armies into battle. Many of these structures persist today and we sometimes struggle to recapture Jesus' intention when he declared himself a king.

Have you thought? The Kingdom of God

When Jesus speaks about the Kingdom of God he never gives a particularly clear picture of what he means. He usually refers to the kingdom with metaphoric language ('the kingdom of God is like ...') and often the kingdom is defined by what it is not. The kingdom is also a real contradiction: it is here and now and yet it is still to come; it is almost impossible for some to enter the kingdom while others are assured a place; it is within us and in our hearts and yet is a great banquet to which all are invited.

FEAST & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK

Monday, 22 November - St Cecilia (Memorial)



Though a late fourth century church in Rome was named after her, nothing is known of her life or death. Popular legends were written about her in the late fifth century, and in the sixteenth century she was named the patron of music. Remembered in tradition as a virgin, martyred for the faith.

Her name is included in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon).

Wednesday, 23 November - Sts Andrew Dūng-Lac & Companions (Memorial)



Baptised at the age of fifteen, worked first as a lay missionary and then as a diocesan presbyter before being beheaded at Hanoi (Vietnam). Listed among 117 canonised martyrs who died in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862: ninety-six Vietnamese, eleven Spanish Dominicans, and ten

presbyters from the Paris Foreign Mission Society. Remembered as representatives of the thousands of Christians tortured and martyred in Vietnam between the seventeenth and nineteenth centuries: bishops, presbyters, religious, and lay people, both children and adults.

Advent, four Sundays and weekdays leading up to the celebration of Christmas, starts next weekend, 28 November. The Advent season is a time of preparation for our hearts and minds for the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. In our Church, marking the Advent season, we put up an Advent Wreath and light candles each week.

The wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to Christmas. The wreath itself, which is made of greens, signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God and the unending life we find in Christ.

The candles have their own special significance. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each weekend. Three of the candles are purple, the liturgical colour, that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice.



The first candle, which is purple, symbolizes hope. It is sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

The second candle, also purple, represents faith. It is called the "Bethlehem Candle" as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

The third candle is pink and symbolise joy. It is called the "Shepard's Candle," and is pink because rose is a liturgical colour for joy. The third Sunday of Advent reminds us of the joy that the faithful have reached the midpoint of Advent.

The fourth candle marks the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Saviour. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizing the song of the angels: "Peace on Earth to the people of good will." The white candle is placed in the middle of the wreath and lit on Christmas Eve. This candle is called the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Christ. The colour white is for purity—because Christ is our sinless, pure Saviour.

Thy kingdom come

From a discourse of Origen on prayer

The coming of the kingdom of God, says our Lord and Saviour, does not admit of observation, and there will be no-one to say "Look here! Look there!" For the kingdom of God is within us and in our hearts. And so it is beyond doubt that whoever prays for the coming of the kingdom of God within himself is praying rightly, praying for the kingdom to dawn in him, bear fruit and reach perfection. For God reigns in every saint, and every saint obeys God's spiritual laws — God, who dwells in him just as he dwells in any well-ordered city. The Father is present in him and in his soul Christ reigns alongside the Father, as it is said: We will come to him and make our dwelling with him.

Therefore, as we continue to move forward without ceasing, the kingdom of God within us will reach its perfection in us at that moment when the saying in the Apostle is fulfilled, that Christ, his enemies all made subject to him, shall deliver the kingdom to God the Father that God may be all in all.

For this reason let us pray without ceasing, our souls filled by a desire made divine by the Word himself. Let us pray to our Father in heaven: hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come.

There is something important that we need to understand about the kingdom of God: just as righteousness has no partnership with lawlessness, just as light has nothing in common with darkness and Christ has no agreement with Belial, so the kingdom of God and a kingdom of sin cannot co-exist.

So if we want God to reign within us, on no account may sin rule in our mortal body but let us mortify our earthly bodies and let us be made fruitful by the Spirit. Then we will be a spiritual garden of Eden for God to walk in. God will rule in us with Christ who will be seated in us on the right hand of God — God, the spiritual power that we pray to receive — until he makes his enemies (who are within us) into his footstool and pours out on us all authority, all power, all strength.

This can happen to any one of us and death, the last enemy may be destroyed, so that in us Christ says Death, where is your sting? Death, where is your victory? So let our corruptibility be clothed today with holiness and incorruption. With Death dead, let our mortality be cloaked in the Father's immortality. With God ruling in us, let us be immersed in the blessings of regeneration and resurrection.
