Holy Trinity, not an eluding concept, but a dear experience



We just concluded the Reconciliation Week, an annual reminder for all Australians the need to connect with the first nation people of our country. What is the wrong that needs reconciliation? The words of Noel Pearson, an aboriginal leader, drives to the heart of the issue. He said "*We are a much unloved people. We are perhaps the ethnic group Australians feel least connected to.*" (*Cathnews 22 March 2023*). Lack of love is grieved because without love there is no life, only hopelessness. With real love there is no frustration nor hopelessness. You cannot adequately explain the mystery of love, whether between groups of people or different individuals; it has to be experienced. You as parents know the beauty of love as you are intimately connected with your child. You spent time with your child and make sacrifices without any complaint; in fact, you do it joyfully. Loving a child or a parent or a spouse brings joy, peace and a sense of purpose in your life.

The foundation of life is the ability to give and receive love. Love is creative. It helps you to have life and have it to the full. The Bible reveals that God is the perfection of love.

Jesus always spoke about his intimacy with the Father. "I am in the Father and the Father is in Me" (Jn 14:10). In a most unprecedented way, Jesus addressed God as "Father" when he taught his disciples how to pray (Ref Mt 6:9-13). Jesus has revealed to us that God is a loving Father. So with confidence we call God "our Father" and long for his loving providence. "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (Jn 3:16).

Jesus also said, "When the Advocate comes, whom I will send you from the Father — the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father — He will testify about Me" (Jn 15:26). The Holy Spirit of God enables the disciples of Jesus to experience the love and service of God more deeply. The Advocate the resurrected Jesus sent us helps us appreciate the ultimate sacrifice and service of Jesus on the Cross as God's unfathomable love for humanity.

God's nature is the love between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We call it the Most Holy Trinity. It is a mystery, like any other love, it has to be experienced and progressively explored rather than looked at as an intellectual puzzle.

God is love. Know God with your heart. This will bring you peace and joy like none other then you will be living your life fuller, and that is the Kingdom of God. You don't have to wait till after death to enter into the Kingdom of God. Enter the Kingdom of God here and now, and you will be able to continue the experience the Kingdom of God after your demise from the earth. The Most Holy Trinity reminds us that our God is not an eluding concept, but a dear experience.

REFLECTIONS ON JOHN 3:16-18

Historical Context – We believe...

The teaching on the Trinity was not formally constructed until the 4th Century and was documented in the creed that emerged from the Council of Nicaea. The Creed that is said today in the Sunday liturgy is a version of that original Nicene Creed. The Nicene Creed spells out Christian beliefs about the nature of God. Jesus and the Spirit and was worded very carefully to negate a variety of heretical views that were held at the time. It is as much a statement about what we do not believe as it is a statement about what we do believe!

Scriptural context – Trinity

At no point in the New Testament is the term 'Trinity' used. That understanding of the nature of God came much later. However, there are a number of scriptural references that led to this theological understanding. The Annunciation, the baptism of Jesus and the great commissioning of the disciples to baptise in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are all examples of the three persons of God being recognised or active in the gospels. Today's second reading shows St Paul using the three experiences of God as a blessing of the people of Corinth.

Living the Gospel – Sign of the Cross

Every time we bless ourselves or begin praver with the sign of the cross, we reaffirm our belief in the Trinity. That seemingly simple prayer, 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,' is, in fact, a confirmation of our belief in a triune God – three in one. The earliest use of the sign of the cross only involved tracing a small cross with the thumb or finger on the forehead as it is still done in baptisms or blessings today. Later, describing the shape of the cross on forehead, abdomen and shoulders became the common practice.

Church Roof Work

Now I can announce that the work of replacing the leaky roof of the church is awarded to Westwood Roofing, a company reputed for heritage roofing. After much negotiations and research we have been reduce the cost of the work by about 40% of the original estimate!

Light, radiance and grace are in the Trinity and from the Trinity A letter of St Athanasius

It will not be out of place to consider the ancient tradition, teaching and faith of the Catholic Church, which was revealed by the Lord, proclaimed by the apostles and guarded by the fathers. For upon this faith the Church is built, and if anyone were to lapse from it, he would no longer be a Christian either in fact or in name.

We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity there is no intrusion of any alien element or of anything from outside, nor is the Trinity a blend of creative and created being. It is a wholly creative and energising reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity of the holy Trinity is preserved. Accordingly, in the Church, one God is preached, one God who is *above all things and through all things and in all things*. God is *above all things* as Father, for he is principle and source; he is *through all things* through the Word; and he is *in all things* in the Holy Spirit.

Writing to the Corinthians about spiritual matters, Paul traces all reality back to one God, the Father, saying: Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in everyone.

Even the gifts that the Spirit dispenses to individuals are given by the Father through the Word. For all that belongs to the Father belongs also to the Son, and so the graces given by the Son in the Spirit are true gifts of the Father. Similarly, when the Spirit dwells in us, the Word who bestows the Spirit is in us too, and the Father is present in the Word. This is the meaning of the text: *My Father and I will come to him and make our home with him.* For where the light is, there also is the radiance; and where the radiance is, there too are its power and its resplendent grace.

This is also Paul's teaching in his second letter to the Corinthians: *The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.* For grace and the gift of the Trinity are given by the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. Just as grace is given from the Father through the Son, so there could be no communication of the gift to us except in the Holy Spirit. But when we share in the Spirit, we possess the love of the Father, the grace of the Son and the fellowship of the Spirit himself.
