New Organist

We have had gaps in provision of music at some 8:00am and 5:00pm masses till the end of the year. Mr Damian Lawrence, a local young man, will be filling in these gaps on the organ assisted by a cantor. Please make them feel very welcome and, of course, join in the singing!

Changes to Sunday Morning Prayer

The 7:45am morning prayer before 8:00am Sunday mass is a bit too close for me to the starting time for mass as I need that time to prepare, so I will be unable to preside that prayer at that time. However, I am very happy if others wish to continue, so if you would like to do so and take responsibility for it, please see me during the week and we will provide the texts in order to do so.

New Weekday Confessions

From next week the 22nd of August I'll be in the confessional for confessions immediately following the weekday mass from Tuesday to Friday, that is to say until 7:45am. My main job here is to give you God and the love of God, and this seems one simple and powerful way to give you what Jesus has given me to give you, that is the peace and freedom and strengthening and healing he gives each of us in the sacrament of confession. Please feel free to make the most of it, and to tell others about it.

New Church Roof

As you may already be aware, Fr Thomas has spent the last 12 months preparing for the works of replacing our very patched original copper roof with a more durable zinc steel sheeting. The work should be starting mid-September and will hopefully be finished by Christmas. The good news is that we will be able to use the church the whole time. The challenge will be that changing a roof is obviously extremely noisy. We are trying to make sure that no work will be done during mass and other normal liturgical times - however, aside from these, praying in the church may be more difficult for a while.

Antiphons & Readings

Entrance Antiphon (Psalm 83:10-11)

Turn your eyes, O God, our shield; and look on the face of your anointed one; one day within your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere.

First Reading (Isaiah 56:1.6-7)

Thus says the Lord: Have a care for justice, act with integrity, for soon my salvation will come and my integrity be manifest.

Foreigners who have attached themselves to the Lord to serve him and to love his name and be his servants – all who observe the sabbath, not profaning it, and cling to my covenant – these I will bring to my holy mountain. I will make them joyful in my house of prayer. Their holocausts and their sacrifices will be accepted on my altar, for my house will be called a house of prayer for all the peoples.

O God, let all the nations praise you!

Second Reading (Romans 11:13-15, 29-32)

Let me tell you pagans this: I have been sent to the pagans as their apostle, and I am proud of being sent, but the purpose of it is to make my own people envious of you, and in this way save some of them. Since their rejection meant the reconciliation of the world, do you know what their admission will mean? Nothing less than a resurrection from the dead! God never takes back his gifts or revokes his choice.

Just as you changed from being disobedient to God, and now enjoy mercy because of their disobedience, so those who are disobedient now – and only because of the mercy shown to you – will also enjoy mercy eventually. God has imprisoned all men in their own disobedience only to show mercy to all mankind.

Jesus preached the Good News of the kingdom and healed all who were sick.
Alleluia!

Gospel (Matthew 15:21-28)

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants.' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply. 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table.' Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.



Feasts & Memorials of the Week

Monday, 21 August - St Pius X (Memorial)



Guiseppe Sarto was born into a poor family in 1835. From He was elected pope in 1903. He took as his motto, "To restore all things in Christ". Pius X was

remembered for advocating the frequent reception of holy communion; reform of church music and encouraging the use of Gregorian chant; the reform of Canon Law; the reorganization of the Roman curia; and the separation of church and state in France. Before his death in 1914, Pius X wrote in his will, "I was born poor, I have lived poor, and I wish to die poor."

Tuesday, 22 August - The Queenship of



the Blessed Virgin Mary (Memorial) This feast was established by Pius XII in 1955 and was celebrated on 31 May. Since 1969 it has been observed on 22 August to stress its

relationship to the Assumption (15 August): taken up into glory, Mary became queen of heaven and earth.

Thursday, 24 August - St Bartholomew (Feast)



Named in the list of apostles and generally identified with Nathaniel of Cana, the "Israelite without guile" (John 1:47) who was led to Jesus by the apostle Philip (3 May). Said to have preached the

gospel in India and in Armenia, where tradition indicates he was martyred.

Mass of Feast at 6.45am.

Q&A with Fr Josh


As a priest, what do you think your main responsibility is? (Kaylie, 6C, SPC)

One of the main responsibilities of a priest is to be as much like Jesus as he can. A priest's job is to give God to people – to give to all people everything God wants to give them, and to pass back to God everything the people want to give to him, never keeping anything for himself. They do this mainly by offering the sacrifice of the Mass, giving the sacraments, preaching and teaching what God reveals to us about who he is, who we are and what the world is, praying for the people and the world, working with all the other members of the Church, and trying to love everyone as God does. 
