I guess I enjoy being a priest because it's all about goodness - receiving all God's goodness (which is always bigger than my heart can receive) and passing it onto everyone, and receiving all people's goodness to me and giving it back to God. I feel like the luckiest guy in the world.

School visits

As chaplain to the Trinity Regents Park campus each week I will 1. teach a class and 2. hear confessions, as well as regularly offer Him to them at school masses. I will also alternate each week between SJW and SPC 1. teaching a class 2. spending time with them in the playground, while also hearing their confessions once a term and regularly celebrating school masses. Please encourage your children to make the most of these opportunities.

Rejoice school of mission and music

Speaking of young people, Rejoice is offering a 9-month program for an all-inclusive 800 euro a month to form youth aged 18-30 in using their musical gifts for the mission of the Church. Antiphons & Readings

Entrance Antiphon (Cf Psalm 85:3,5)

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long. O Lord, you are good and forgiving, full of mercy to all who call to you.

First Reading (Jeremiah 20:7-9)

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced; you have overpowered me: you were the stronger. I am a daily laughing-stock, everybody's butt. Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!' The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long. I used to say, I will not think about him, I will not speak in his name any more. Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones. The effort to restrain it wearied me. I could not bear it.

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 62:2-6. 8-9. R. v.2)

My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God.

Second Reading (Romans 12:1-2)

Think of God's mercy, my brothers, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your living bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

Gospel Acclamation (See Ephesians 1:17-18)

Alleluia, alleluia!

May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our heart, that we might see how great is the hope to which we are called.

Gospel (Matthew 16:21-27)

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

Friday, 8 September - The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Feast)

This feast originated in Jerusalem about the sixth century, a development of the feast of the dedication of the church of Saint Anne, built in Jerusalem "where Mary was born". Observed in Rome in the seventh century, it was later used to determine the date of Mary's Immaculate Conception. Because of her importance in salvation history, Mary's birthday is celebrated as well as those of her son Jesus the Lord, and of Saint John the Baptist (24 June).
