From the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters,

Why can't we say both creeds in church? (Malia, 6C)

We can, Malia - just not at the same time! The longer creed, the Nicene creed, is an affirmation of what we believe, and Christians have always believed, formulated 1600 years ago. The Apostles' Creed is even older. In saying them, after having heard the Word of God, we affirm we believe all the fundamental things God has revealed to us about who he is and who we are, and before the liturgy of the Eucharist, that we are in communion with the universal Church across all time and space as we prepare to receive this one and same God who has been speaking to us.

Roofwork begins

The long-awaited work on our new roof will begin on Monday 18 September. The first week will be spent putting up the scaffolding. This will be followed by three weeks of stripping off the old roof. Daily morning mass and confessions will continue in the church, but other masses (with the exception of funerals) may have to take place in the hall (to be confirmed). Please be aware that this will be a very noisy process - but that the church, as always, will remain open for personal prayer. Please be attentive to obey all the signs and directions we need to give you, as they are there to protect you.

Antiphons & Readings

Entrance Antiphon (Cf Sirach 36:18)

Give peace, O Lord, to those who wait for you, that your prophets be found true. Hear the prayers of your servant, and of your people Israel.

First Reading (Sirach 27:30 – 28:7)

Resentment and anger, these are foul things, and both are found with the sinner. He who exacts vengeance will experience the vengeance of the Lord, who keeps strict account of sin. Forgive your neighbour the hurt he does you, and when you pray, your sins will be forgiven. If a man nurses anger against another, can he then demand compassion from the Lord? Showing no pity for a man like himself, can he then plead for his own sins? Mere creature of flesh, he cherishes resentment; who will forgive him his sins? Remember the last things, and stop hating, remember dissolution and death, and live by the commandments. Remember the commandments, and do not bear your neighbour ill-will; remember the covenant of the Most High, and overlook the offence.'

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 94:1-2.6-9. R. v.8)

The Lord is kind and merciful; slow to anger and rich in compassion.

Second Reading (Romans 14:7-9)

The life and death of each of us has its influence on others; if we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord, so that alive or dead we belong to the Lord. This explains why Christ both died and came to life, it was so that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living.

Gospel Acclamation (John 13:34)

Alleluia, alleluia! I give you a new commandment: love one another as I have loved you. Alleluia!

Gospel (Matthew 18:21-35)

Peter went up to Jesus and said, 'Lord, how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'Not seven, I tell you, but seventy-seven times.

'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time," he said "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me", he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said. "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.'

Feasts & Memorials of the Week

Wednesday, 20 September - Sts Andrew Kim Tae-gŏn, Paul Chŏng Ha-sang & Companions, Martyrs



(Memorial) Andrew Kim Taegon was the first Korean presbyter and Paul Chong Hasang a catechist

and lay apostle. After more than two centuries of lay leadership, the Church in Korea was subject to fierce persecutions between 1839 and 1867. This commemorates 103 of the numerous Korean

martyrs, representatives from all walks of life: men and women, married and unmarried, the elderly, teenagers and children, missionary bishops and presbyters. Remembered

for their fearless witness in the face of torture and death. Mass of Feast at 6.45am.

Thursday, 21 September - St Matthew (Feast) Matthew, also known as Levi, was a Jew who collected taxes for the Romans at Capernaum in



Galilee. Here Jesus met him and called him to be an apostle (Luke 5:27-28). Venerated as the author of the gospel which highlights Jesus' role as Messiah and underlines the presence of the kingdom of God in the Church. *Mass of Feast at 6.45am.*

Saturday, 23 September - St Pius of Pietrelcina (Memorial)



Born on 25 May 1887 in Pietrelcina (Italy). Died on this day in 1968 at San Giovanni Rotondo (Italy). Raised in a deeply religious rural home, Francesco Forgione became Padre Pio when he was ordained in the Capuchin order in 1910. A mystic who received the marks of the stigmata in 1918, a renowned holy man, and a charity worker

who founded a hospital (the House for the Relief of Suffering). His ascetic life of pain led to special compassion for the suffering. Remembered as an extraordinary confessor and spiritual director. *Mass of Feast at 6.45am*
