From the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters,

What is the Catholic view of the referendum?

The official view of the Catholic Bishops on both 5 May and 26 September can be summarised as follows:

- 1. The bishops endorsed the Statement from the Heart in 2021.
- 2. It's important that our Indigenous be recognised in the constitution.
- 3. The Voice is not our only option it's one of a number of options which might help.
- 4. The bishops have not recommended voting yes or no, but that "people may, in good faith, have differing concerns and perspectives." where "there are some who strongly support the Voice and others who have concerns including whether the Voice would benefit those most in need or could stifle good governance."

Four other general guiding principles might be helpful to keep in mind:

- a. Do good, avoid evil.
- b. Authentic love says yes sometimes, and says no other times.
- c. Arguments based on insults are not arguments, and can be dismissed out of hand.
- d. Acting based just on how we feel or might feel is not love. Neither is acting based on our feelings acting from the heart. To act from the heart is to use our whole heart, that is our intelligence, our will, our memory, and the law of God written there, as well as our feelings. To vote lovingly is to make a choice where we take into account (1) reasoned arguments, (2) the law of God, (3) the particular situation, as well as (4) our feelings, and vote in a way which is (5) good, for all Australians.

In short: the moral imperative for the referendum is to feel totally free and not pressured, to inform ourselves well about the proposal and its possible consequences, and to vote for what we think is good for Australia, taking into account God's law, reasoned argument, the particular circumstances, as well as our feelings.

Antiphons & Readings

Entrance Antiphon (Cf Esther 4:17)

Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

First Reading (Isaiah 5:1-7)

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead?

Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 79:9. 12-16. 19-20. R. Is 5:7)

The vineyard of the Lord is the House of Israel.

Second Reading (Philippians 4:6-9)

There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, fill your minds with everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good and pure, everything that we love and honour, and everything that can be thought virtuous or worthy of praise. Keep doing all the things that you learnt from me and have

been taught by me and have heard or seen that I do. Then the God of peace will be with you.

Gospel Acclamation (See John 15:15)

Alleluia, alleluia!

I call you friends, says the Lord, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. Alleluia!

Gospel (Matthew 21:33-43)

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see? 'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'

The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to the soul that seeks him.


Christmas Lunch Donation & Volunteers
