From the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters,

Referendum

Less than 40% of Australians voted for the proposed Voice to Parliament (just over 1/3 here in Blaxland). While good critiques can be made of the process and of the way both campaigns were conducted, it's important that we recognise three goods about the experience: that, unlike many places, we have a democracy where people feel really free to think, discuss and make their own choice, regardless of resources or influence; that everyone was obliged to spend time considering the disadvantaged amongst us, which we probably do too rarely; and that, as both sides agree, we are keen to work together to resolve these disadvantages and be completely reconciled with our Indigenous brothers and sisters, of whom we are rightfully proud. This should be part of our regular prayer and activity as Christians.

Roof

Progress on the roof is coming along nicely. 75% of the old roof has been stripped off. Weather-permitting it should be done by 20 October. It has been replaced by high quality sarking, which will be watertight until the new zinc sheets are installed. Some of the roof timbers were discovered to be rotten or damaged, and have been replaced. The new sheets will be cut off-site, and then lifted onto the roof by a mobile crane. New rain heads will also be installed. The white cross on top of the church was found to be moving around: it has been temporarily taken down, will be sand-blasted, re-galvanised, repainted the same colour, have new, 'warmer' white LEDs installed and be reinstalled on a new fixed plate. If we have good weather the main roof will be finished before Christmas.

Parish vision and mission

It has been some time since we last considered our parish vision and mission. Knowing our own ultimate goals will help us plan activities for next year to achieve them. In coming months we will consider this together and, with the help of the pastoral council, have these clarified by next year. I would welcome any thoughts you have about what you think God is calling us to, so feel free to email or give these to the parish secretary, which she will collate in a file and serve as a basis for moving forward.

New licence deed for the sisters

At the request of the sisters and the archdiocese, in order for the sisters to get the benefit of the significant investment they are making in their renovation of our convent chapel, and following the recommendations of the Finance Committee and the Pastoral Council, I have signed a new licence deed on behalf of the parish which will extend the Sisters' residence in our convent for another 10 years. We are blessed to be just about the only parish in the diocese, and in wider Sydney, to have a congregation of young missionary sisters who pray so much for us and spend so much time with our young people. May God bless their work!

Jude "(son) of James" (Luke 6:16; Acts 1:13) was traditionally thought to be the same person as Jude, brother of James and author of the letter of Jude, but may also be the one called "Thaddeus" (Matthew 10:3; Mark 3:18). A tradition has Simon and Jude preaching and being martyred in Persia. Honoured among the twelve apostles, the first followers of Christ.
