Gospel (Mark 4:26-34)

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own

accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.

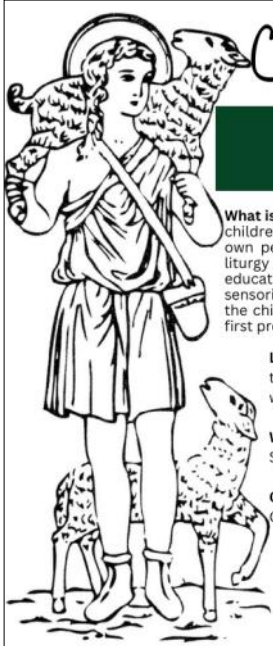

ST. PETER CHANEL ATRIUM Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

What is CGS? Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a faith formation process for children aged 3 to 12 years. The central aim is to help the child nurture their own personal relationship with God. CGS is grounded in scripture and the liturgy of the Church, and framed by Maria Montessori's principles of education. This allows children to hear the Gospel through the use of sensorially rich materials. The adult's task is to prepare the sacred space for the children, called the Atrium, so that they can respond to this relationship first proclaimed to them through Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

Learn more! Our school has recently opened an Atrium. If you would like to learn more about CGS and the Adult Formation Course (Level 1) that will occur later in the year, we are offering a *Come and See* evening.
